Forced Displacement

UNHCR: Ukraine, other conflicts push forcibly displaced total over 100 million for first time Figure must 'serve as a wake-up call' for more action to promote peace and address all causes of forced displacement, says UN High Commissioner for Refugees, Filippo Grandi 23 May 2022

GENEVA - The number of people forced to flee conflict, violence, human rights violations and persecution has now crossed the staggering milestone of 100 million for the first time on record, propelled by the war in Ukraine and other deadly conflicts.

"One hundred million is a stark figure – sobering and alarming in equal measure. It's a record that should never have been set," said UN High Commissioner for Refugees, Filippo Grandi. "This must serve as a wake-up call to resolve and prevent destructive conflicts, end persecution, and address the underlying causes that force innocent people to flee their homes."

According to new data from UNHCR, the UN Refugee Agency, the number of forcibly displaced people worldwide rose towards 90 million by the end of 2021, propelled by new waves of violence or protracted conflict in countries including Ethiopia, Burkina Faso, Myanmar, Nigeria, Afghanistan and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. In addition, the war in Ukraine has displaced 8 million within the country this year, and more than 6 million refugee movements from Ukraine have been registered.

At over 1 per cent of the global population, the overall figure is equivalent to the 14th most populous country in the world. It includes refugees and asylum seekers as well as the 53.2 million people displaced inside their borders by conflict, according to a <u>recent report</u> from the Internal Displacement Monitoring Centre (IDMC).

"The international response to people fleeing war in Ukraine has been overwhelmingly positive," Grandi added. "Compassion is alive and we need a similar mobilization for all crises around the world. But ultimately, humanitarian aid is a palliative, not a cure. To reverse this trend, the only answer is peace and stability so that innocent people are not forced to gamble between acute danger at home or precarious flight and exile."

UNHCR will release its annual Global Trends Report on June 16, outlining a full set of global, regional and national data on forced displacement for 2021, as well as more limited updates to April 2022, and details on returns and solutions.

Resolution on "Health emergency in Ukraine"

In a vote (with 88 yes, 12 no, 53 abstentions), delegates at the World Health Assembly agreed a resolution on the "Health emergency in Ukraine and refugee receiving and hosting countries, stemming from the Russian Federation's aggression."

Among other issues, the resolution brings attention to the direct and indirect health impacts in Ukraine, in the region and beyond; condemns attacks on health care, as documented by WHO's Surveillance System for Attacks on Health Care; and urges the Russian Federation to immediately cease any attacks on hospitals and other healthcare facilities.

...PP5 Recalling the Constitution of the World Health Organization and its references to the Charter of the United Nations; the obligation of all States under Article 2 of the Charter of the United Nations to refrain in their international relations from the threat or use of force against the territorial integrity or political independence of any state, or in any other manner inconsistent with the purposes of the United Nations, and to settle their international disputes by peaceful means; and the obligation under Article 2 of the Charter of the United Nations, that all Members, in order to ensure the rights and benefits resulting from membership, shall fulfill in good faith the obligations assumed by them in accordance with the Charter;...

...**PP10** Expressing grave concerns over the ongoing health emergency in Ukraine and refugee receiving and hosting countries, triggered by the Russian Federation's aggression against Ukraine, resulting in conflict-related trauma and injuries as well as increased risks of illness and death from non-communicable diseases (NCDs), of emergence and spread of infectious diseases, of mental health and psychosocial health deterioration, of human trafficking, of gender-based violence, and of sexual and reproductive health including maternal and child health deterioration;

PP11 Alarmed in particular by the **disproportionate impact of disrupted health services on vulnerable groups**, such as women and children, internally displaced persons, elderly people and persons with disabilities;

PP12 Further alarmed by the health impacts of the Russian Federation's aggression which have regional and wider-than-regional significance, including, inter alia, significant

numbers of refugees fleeing Ukraine; the risks of radiological, biological and chemical events and hazards; and the exacerbation of an already significant global food security crisis;...

OP1 CONDEMNS IN THE STRONGEST TERMS Russian Federation's military aggression against Ukraine, including attacks on health care facilities documented via the WHO's Surveillance System for Attacks on Health Care (SSA);

OP2 DRAWS ATTENTION to the fact that the **Russian Federation's aggression against Ukraine constitutes exceptional circumstances**, causing a serious impediment to the health of the population of Ukraine, as well as having regional and wider than regional health impacts;

OP3 URGES the Russian Federation to immediately cease any attacks on hospitals and other healthcare facilities;

OP4 ALSO URGES the Russian Federation to fully respect and protect all medical personnel and humanitarian personnel exclusively engaged in medical duties, their means of transport and equipment;

OP5 FURTHER URGES respect for and protection of the sick and wounded, including civilians, health and humanitarian aid workers, healthcare systems consistent with the Geneva Conventions and their Additional Protocols, and with broader international humanitarian law;

OP6 DECIDES that continued action by the Russian Federation to the detriment of the health situation in Ukraine, at regional and global levels, would necessitate that the Assembly should consider the application of relevant articles of WHO Constitution

OP7. URGES the relevant Member States:

- (1) to adhere to international humanitarian law, international human rights law, and WHO norms and standards;
- (2) to allow and facilitate safe, rapid and unhindered access to populations in need of assistance by staff deployed by the World Health Organization on the ground, and by all other medical and humanitarian personnel;
- (3) to ensure the free flow of essential medicines, medical equipment and other health technologies in all conflict and non-conflict areas;...

WHO members condemn Russia, warn its voting rights could be stripped

The World Health Assembly on Thursday voted <u>in favor of a resolution</u> that condemned Russian attacks on the health-care system in Ukraine before rejecting a <u>parallel proposal</u> presented by Moscow that Kyiv's representative to the United Nations in Geneva had called a "subterfuge" that presented a "twisted alternative reality" of the conflict.

Ukraine's successful resolution, which was backed by member states 88-to-12 with 53 abstentions, raises the possibility that Russia could be suspended from the assembly if attacks on hospitals and clinics continue. The assembly is the decision-making body of the World Health Organization, a United Nations global health agency with a sprawling mandate.

A counterproposal put forward by Russia and Syria, which suggested that Kyiv bears the blame for some civilian deaths, was also rejected on Thursday, 15-to-66 with 70 abstentions. Ukrainian diplomats have accused Russia of copying the language that condemned an "ongoing health emergency in and around Ukraine" while stripping any language that said Russia was to blame.

Russian diplomats speaking at the assembly accused Ukraine of trying to use a traditionally apolitical forum to settle scores. Vasily Nebenzya, permanent representative of Russia to the United Nations, told the assembly that it was unacceptable to use the WHO to "stigmatize one country."...

The dueling votes at the annual assembly in Geneva were the latest blow to Russia's standing in international organizations since it invaded Ukraine on Feb. 24. Two U.N. General Assembly resolutions passed in March censured Russia for its aggression, and the country was suspended from the U.N. Human Rights Council on April 7...

Davos-Klosters, Switzerland, 26 May 2022 – World leaders came together at the World Economic Forum Annual Meeting 2022 against a backdrop of deepening global frictions and fractures and a once-in-a-century pandemic.

On Monday, President Zelenskyy addressed participants live from Kyiv. He said that the words "turning point" have "become more than just a rhetorical figure of speech" and emphasized that "values must matter". The war in Ukraine has created immense human suffering. And the wider impacts of the conflict are being felt around the world.

The World Economic Forum called for a "Marshall Plan" for the reconstruction of Ukraine...The Special Dialogue on Ukraine session brought together 70 global CEOs alongside the Prime Minister of Ukraine (who joined virtually), with the President of the European Commission, the Foreign Minister of Ukraine and the First Deputy Prime Minister of Ukraine at Davos in person, alongside other dignitaries. CEOs offered concrete ways of how their companies can support the Ukraine government and its private sector in the reconstruction of Ukraine now, rather than waiting for the war to end...

Nature and climate

The energy crisis, exacerbated by the war in Ukraine, must not deepen the world's dependence on climate-warming fossil fuels. During the week, there was a focus on accelerating clean energy and climate solutions:

More than 50 companies have now joined the First Movers Coalition, which was launched by US President Biden and the World Economic Forum at COP26 to decarbonize the heavy industry and long-distance transport sectors – the sectors responsible for 30% of global emissions...

Eight new countries have joined the First Movers Coalition as government partners – Denmark, India, Italy, Japan, Norway, Singapore, Sweden and the UK. All are committed to create early markets for clean technologies. Alongside the United States, there are nine committed government partners.

Some 70+ CEOs of the **CEO Climate Leaders Alliance** – the largest CEO-led climate action group globally – **agreed on taking bold action to translate pledges into tangible emission reductions in line with 1.5C**. Covering 26 countries and 12 industries and representing 120 companies in total, the alliance has a combined annual emission footprint greater than India or the EU...

China's Special Envoy for Climate Change Xie Zhenhua announced **his country's contribution to plant and conserve 70 billion trees by 2030.** The World Economic Forum and China Green Foundation will undertake concrete measures together through 1t.org China Action to support the fulfilment of China's contribution...

The Forum's Global New Mobility Coalition is launching the Urban Mobility Scorecards initiative. Over 30 companies, such as Visa, Hyundai, Uber, Volta Trucks and TIER, will work with policy-makers from cities and regions to better understand challenges and solutions to **create a shared, connected and decarbonized mobility ecosystem.**

A new Global Commission on the Economics of Water was launched to redefine the way we value and incorporate water into economic decision-making...

Economic transformation

The Forum's Chief Economists Outlook report warned of "dire human consequences" from the fragmentation of the global economy. It said that developing economies face trade-offs between the risks of debt crisis and securing food and fuel. The rising cost of living hits the world's poorest communities hardest. The Ukraine conflict has exacerbated already fragile energy and food systems. Co-investment by the public and private sector is critical to restarting a new era of growth, one that integrates inclusion and sustainability at its core rather than an afterthought, and is the best way forward for shared prosperity.

A leading group of CEOs, ministers and academic experts **agreed on the roadmap for the Market**Creators Alliance to develop fairer principles for governments, businesses and publicprivate partnerships on innovation and industrial development. This will be launched later this year.

<u>Four Futures for Economic Globalization: Scenarios and Their Implications</u> outlines how the nature of globalization may shift as economic powers choose between fragmentation or integration in both the physical and virtual dimensions of the world economy...

Education and skills

The <u>Reskilling Revolution</u> initiative, launched at the Annual Meeting in 2020, has now mobilized a community of over 50 CEOs, 350 organizations and 15 countries all working towards a vision of giving 1 billion people better education, reskilling and upskilling...

The initiative will now expand beyond adult learning to add a focus on education for children and youth. These efforts will be taken forward by a new <u>Education 4.0 Alliance</u>, bringing together 20 leading education organizations, and Bangladesh has become the first country to adopt the education accelerator model in Davos...

Diversity, equity, inclusion and social justice

...The Valuable 500 initiative announced **a unique mentorship programme** – <u>Generation</u>

<u>Valuable</u> – **for people with disabilities** to build the future executive leadership, driving disability inclusion by revolutionizing the boardrooms of tomorrow.

<u>The Edison Alliance</u> launched a new programme to speed up digital inclusion in the life-critical sectors of health, education and finance. It launched a new network of "lighthouse countries", including Bahrain, Bangladesh and Rwanda, working with the UN Development Programme to further the alliance's 1 billion lives vision of providing people with affordable, digital solutions by 2025.

Trade and supply chains

...The <u>World Investment for Development Alliance was launched</u> together with OECD Secretary-General Matthias Cormann, the World Bank, UNCTAD and other partners, to increase collaboration in addressing investment policy and practice...

Health

...The **Global Fund to Fight AIDS, tuberculosis and malaria announced its first pledge** from the private sector in Davos. It has raised a third of the \$18 billion needed to reverse setbacks caused by the pandemic.

Building on <u>recommendations developed</u> in partnership with the European Union COVID-19 lung cancer taskforce, the Forum, together with the Lung Ambition Alliance, **launched the Global Lung Cancer Collaboration** to bring together organizations in healthcare delivery, research, diagnostics, biopharma, patient advocacy and non-governmental organizations to facilitate greater collaboration and solutions to eliminate lung cancer as a leading cause of death.

An **Accord for a Healthier World was launched at Davos by Pfizer** this week, providing all its current and future patent-protected medicines and vaccines available in the US or EU on a not-for-profit basis to 45 lower-income countries...Rwanda, Ghana, Malawi, Senegal and Uganda are the first five countries to commit to join the accord...

Tech frontiers

The World Economic Forum **unveiled the concept of a Global Collaboration Village**, a major initiative to harness the potential of the metaverse to create a place where international cooperation can be strengthened.

The <u>Defining and Building the Metaverse</u> initiative was launched bringing together key stakeholders to define and build the parameters of **an economically viable**, **interoperable**, **safe and inclusive metaverse**.

The <u>Global Coalition for Digital Safety</u> has committed to developing emergency protocols for **protecting digital safety during wars**, particularly to tackle online exploitation and abuse, violent extremist and terrorist content, and mis- and disinformation. This will complement the broader work of the coalition to make the internet safer by tackling harmful content and conduct online...

Closing

In a closing address, Olaf Scholz, Chancellor of Germany, called for "a sustainable, resilient globalization which uses natural resources sparingly and, above all, takes the needs of future generations into account", adding that a new approach to globalization would be "based on solidarity which benefits all citizens – in all parts of the world."



Periodic Table of Food Initiative

The Periodic Table of Food Initiative (PTFI) is a global effort to create a public database of the biochemical composition and function of the food we eat. The PTFI will strengthen and support ongoing work by institutions around the world by developing low-cost mass spectrometry kits, standards, methods, cloud-based analytical tools, and a public database – the Periodic Table of Food (PTF) – that will include a quantitative and qualitative analysis of thousands of foods. The PTFI will begin by analyzing 1,000 foods that are representative of the geographic and cultural diversity worldwide.

Once the database is in place, the scientific community and private sector can build on this public resource by adding analysis of additional foods, varieties, and cooking methods. The PTFI technical platform will enable conditions for a rapid acceleration in research and innovation.



Inventory of Foods

PTFI has undertaken a global multi stakeholder collaborative process to seek nominations of and select foods from all regions of the world. Dietary importance, geographical diversity and innovation potential are some of the criteria used for the identification and selection of foods. The result of this process is a remarkable collection of the most inspiring foods from every region of the world, which are of great cultural and scientific interest. PTFI will share results of the work widely.

Technical Platform

The PTFI is creating a technical platform for standardized mass spectrometry-based analytical approaches for deep compositional analyses of food including the discovery of new food molecules. It will comprise kits, methods, and data processing services to enable a network of public and private laboratories to analyze thousands of foods around the globe by food composition category. The PTFI is taking a phased approach to the development of kits, informed by the initial inventory of initial foods before expanding it to a broader set of foods from across the world. To develop this technical platform, PTFI is working with reagent manufacturing, mass spectrometry, and data processing companies across the globe.

<u>Periodic Table of Food Initiative Launches With an Aim to Revolutionize Human and Planetary Health</u>

A global effort to standardize food analysis will help better understand the impact on human health, agriculture, and nutrition.

GENEVA | May 20, 2022 —The technology that mapped the human genetic code led to major breakthroughs in understanding, diagnosing and even curing illnesses. Now, the <u>Periodic Table of Food</u> <u>Initiative</u> (PTFI) is using a similar approach to deepen knowledge about food composition.

The Initiative, supported by The Rockefeller Foundation and its public charity, RF Catalytic Capital, Inc. (RFCC), the Foundation for Food & Agriculture Research and the Seerave Foundation, and facilitated by the American Heart Association® and the Alliance of Bioversity and CIAT (International Center for Tropical Agriculture), officially launches at an event during the World Health Assembly in Geneva.

Sustainable, diverse foods that complement individual needs can help prevent malnourishment. However, our scientific understanding of the foods that nourish us is still rudimentary. At most, 150 of foods' biochemical components are measured and tracked in conventional databases, representing only a tiny fraction of the tens of thousands of biochemicals in food. The PTFI will characterize and quantify these components in food to catalyze major breakthroughs in nutrition and agriculture.

The need to improve the food system is pressing, as poor nutrition increases the global burden of disease and perpetuates ill-health and cycles of poverty.1 Additionally, unsustainable agricultural practices, food-based greenhouse gas emissions, market disruptions, food distribution and waste, and a growing population, are degrading the natural resource base that supports nutrition and food security.2

"Food and nutritional security are at the center of many pressing global challenges, yet much remains unknown about what's in our food and how it affects the health of people and the planet," said Selena Ahmed, Global Director of the Periodic Table of Food Initiative. "The first step is to standardize not only the way scientists collect food composition data globally, but also what type of data they collect. Then, we will be able to use and share that data to reduce the global burden of diet-related diseases while also reducing the strain on the environment."

The utilisation of vaccines in humanitarian crises, 2015–2019: A review of practice

Abstract

Background

The risk factors that emerge with the onset and protraction of humanitarian crises leave populations at a heightened risk of excess morbidity and mortality from vaccine-preventable diseases (VPDs). There is currently little clarity on which vaccines are being used in crises throughout the world, and whether vaccination decisions correspond to local disease threats. This review aimed to collect and analyse such information.

Methods

We reviewed vaccination services from January 2015 to June 2019 across all 25 humanitarian responses that had an activated coordination mechanism during this period. A range of online sources and informants within the humanitarian sector were consulted to compile data on which vaccines were provided in each crisis, and the modality and timing of vaccine provision. The package of vaccination services since the start of each crisis was then compared with local disease burden (baseline + excess due to crisis-emergent risk factors).

Results

The range of vaccines used in humanitarian crises appears limited. When offered, vaccines were primarily delivered through the pre-existing routine schedule, with few supplementary actions taken in recognition of the need for rapidly enhancing population immunity. Vaccine packages mostly did not address the actual range of VPDs that likely accounted for substantial disease risk. Conclusions

This review suggests inconsistencies and inequities in vaccine provision to crisis-affected populations. A consistent, standardised and broader approach to vaccine use in crises is needed.

<u>UN Undersecretary-General Says Failure to Share COVID-19 Vaccines with Global South 'Is Racism'</u>

Davos-Klosters, Switzerland, 25 May 2022 – A top United Nations official at the Annual Meeting of the World Economic Forum 2022 declared that "policy violence" – such as the refusal to share COVID-19 vaccines with the Global South – is as racist as the police violence that ended the life of African-American George Floyd in Minneapolis two years ago today.

"Racism is not only when black people or brown people cannot breathe because of police violence. Racism is when black people, brown people, people of colour take their last breath because of policy violence, when they are denied life-saving, pandemic-ending medicines... when they can't access care or education because debt is choking them. That's racism," said Winnie Byanyima, Undersecretary-General of the United Nations and Executive Director of the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS), speaking at a session on racial equity at the World Economic Forum 2022.

Some 18 months after the first COVID-19 vaccines became available, 75% of people in high-income countries, mainly white, are fully vaccinated, while just 13% of people in low-income countries, mostly brown and black, are vaccinated, she said. "Wouldn't you call that racism?"...

Weekly epidemiological update on COVID-19 - 25 May 2022

Overview

Globally, the number of new weekly cases has continued the declining trend observed since a peak in January 2022. During the week of 16 through 22 May 2022, over 3.7 million cases were reported, a 3% decrease as compared to the previous week. The number of new weekly deaths also continues to decline, with over 9000 fatalities reported, representing an 11% decrease as compared to the previous week.

As of 22 May 2022, over 522 million confirmed cases and over six million deaths have been reported globally.

In this edition, we provide an update on the geographic distribution of circulating SARS-CoV-2 variants of concern (VOCs), including the prevalence and summary of current evidence of the Omicron variant. We also provide updates on vaccine effectiveness for the Omicron variant.




Figure 1. COVID-19 cases reported weekly by WHO Region, and global deaths, as of 22 May 2022**

...The most recent IMB meeting and this, the board's 21st, report picks up progress and the story of polio eradication during 2022 so far...

Recommendation Number 10 [of 10]

The pandemic-related cancellation or delays in vaccination rounds, as well as the negative impact on the delivery of essential immunisation services because of the pandemic, has led to an accumulation of un-vaccinated and under- vaccinated children. This is on top of already lower than required essential immunisation coverage rates in countries with outbreaks, those vulnerable to outbreaks, and the endemic (or recently endemic) populations of Nigeria, Pakistan and Afghanistan. Important strategic shifts in polio transition planning and implementation are driving the necessity of programmatic integration to address the need to rapidly strengthen essential immunisation programmes, particularly in countries that will transition completely out of Gavi and GPEI support at the end of 2022.

The IMB recommends that reactive and outbreak response activities, as well as preventive vaccination activities, are implemented in a multiantigen format where possible, signalling the importance to communities that polio immunisation is a mainstream children's health necessity and not some sort of West-driven special project.

- Over 6 million people received food assistance and 2 million health-related support from the UN and humanitarian partners since 24 February.

In a survey of 4,127 boys and young men from four countries – Brazil, Indonesia, the Netherlands and Uganda – the most common reason cited for avoiding the topic was that menstruation is a 'private matter' for girls and women.

The respondents, aged between 16 to 25, also admitted they frequently associate periods with words such as 'dirty' (55%), 'embarrassing' (31%) and 'disgusting' (38%).

Since the identification of the SARS-CoV-2 in Wuhan, China, in January 2020 (1), the origin of the virus has been a topic of intense scientific debate and public speculation. The two main hypotheses are that the virus emerged from human exposure to an infected animal ["zoonosis" (2)] or that it emerged in a research-related incident (3). The investigation into the origin of the virus has been made difficult by the lack of key evidence from the earliest days of the outbreak—there's no doubt that greater transparency on the part of Chinese authorities would be enormously helpful. Nevertheless, we argue here that there is much important information that can be gleaned from US-based research institutions, information not yet made available for independent, transparent, and scientific scrutiny.
