## **Cascading Crises**

### **Crisis fatigue not an option as global hunger crisis deepens, the International Red Cross Red Crescent Movement warns**

*News release* 13 September 2022

Geneva (ICRC/IFRC) – The warning lights are flashing on high: **armed conflict, climate-related emergencies, economic hardship and political obstacles are leading to a growing wave of hunger in countries around the world. The misery for millions will deepen without immediate urgent action.**

**Systems-level improvements must be made to escape a cycle of recurrent crises**, including investments in climate-smart food production in conflict-affected areas, and reliable mechanisms to support hard-to-reach communities hit by food shortages and skyrocketing prices, the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) and the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) said ahead of the upcoming United Nations General Assembly.

**The international armed conflict in Ukraine has greatly disrupted global food supply systems as well as future harvests in many countries due to the impact it's having on the availability of fertilizer.** The importance of more shipments by the Black Sea grain initiative reaching vulnerable populations in East Africa cannot be overstated. Too few grain shipments are getting to where they are needed.

**As hunger emergencies hit the headlines, the risk of crisis fatigue is high. Yet what's uniquely frightening about this moment is the breadth and depth of the needs. More than 140 million people face acute food insecurity due to conflict and instability**, even as climate change and economic precarity indicate that hunger needs will rise in the coming months.

Political will and resources are needed now. Without them, many lives will be lost, and the suffering will endure for years. An emergency response alone will not end these hunger crises. Concerted action and long-term approaches are the only way to break the cycle.

While addressing urgent needs, it is essential to set the foundation for resilience. More efforts must be made — by governments, private sectors, and humanitarian and development groups — to support long-term food security, livelihoods, and resilience plans.

Measures must include investments in strengthening grassroots food systems and community actors to sustainably achieve food and economic security. **One of the approaches to consider is anticipatory action for food security, based on forecasts and risk analysis.**

Francesco Rocca, president of the IFRC, said: "Two dozen countries across Africa are grappling with the worst food crisis in decades. Some 22 million people in the Horn of Africa are in the clutches of

starvation due to such compounding crises as drought, flooding, COVID-19's economic effects, conflict – even desert locusts. Behind the staggeringly high numbers are real people – men, women and children battling death-level hunger every day. The situation is expected to deteriorate into 2023. However, with swift action, many lives can be saved. We need urgent and massive action to scale up life-saving assistance to millions of people in dire need of aid, but also to decisively address the root causes of this crisis through longer term commitments.”...

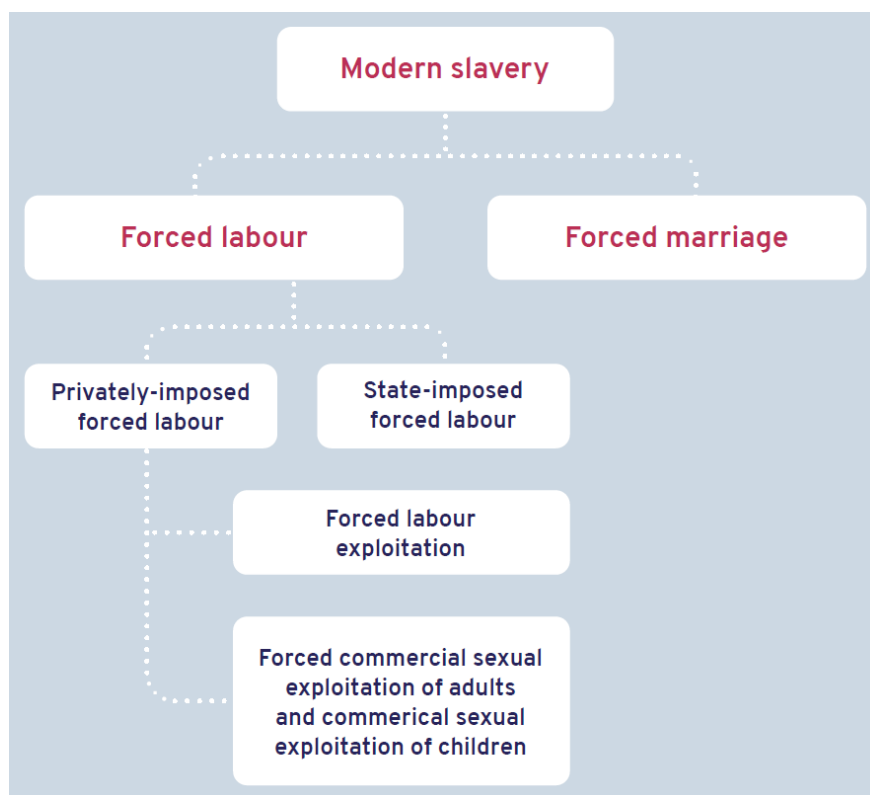
### Global Estimates of Modern Slavery :: Forced Labour and Forced Marriage

International Labour Organization (ILO), Walk Free, and International Organization for Migration (IOM)  
September 2022 :: 144 pages

*[Excerpt]*

...Today, 50 million people around the world are in some form of slavery – whether it is considered “contemporary” or is a centuries-old practice, and whether it occurs in the world of work, as in the case of forced labour, or outside, as in the case of forced marriage. And the challenge of modern slavery appears to be growing. Millions of additional people – women, men, girls and boys – have fallen victim to forced labour and forced marriage in recent years.

This report, the 2021 Global Estimates of Modern Slavery: Forced Labour and Forced Marriage, assesses the situation of modern slavery in the world today and the key policy priorities for ending it among children by 2025 and universally by 2030, in accordance with the target dates set by the international community in the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has heightened the risk of modern slavery and made the road to the 2025 and 2030 target dates an even more difficult one. For Ran, Ida, Bianca, Jasmine, Lyn, and many millions of others, the decisions that national governments and the international community make as the world seeks to build forward better in the wake of the pandemic and regain momentum in the fight against modern slavery will be fundamental. For them, what is at stake is no less than their ability to live out their lives in freedom...

### [50 million people worldwide in modern slavery](#)

12 September 2022

GENEVA (ILO News) – Fifty million people were living in modern slavery in 2021, according to the latest Of these people, 28 million were in forced labour and 22 million were trapped in forced marriage.

**The number of people in modern slavery has risen significantly in the last five years. 10 million more people were in modern slavery in 2021 compared to 2016 global estimates.** Women and children remain disproportionately vulnerable.

Modern slavery occurs in almost every country in the world, and cuts across ethnic, cultural and religious lines. **More than half (52 per cent) of all forced labour and a quarter of all forced marriages can be found in upper-middle income or high-income countries.**

### ***Forced labour***

**Most cases of forced labour (86 per cent) are found in the private sector.** Forced labour in sectors other than commercial sexual exploitation accounts for 63 per cent of all forced labour, while forced commercial sexual exploitation represents 23 per cent of all forced labour. Almost four out of five of those in forced commercial sexual exploitation are women or girls. State-imposed forced labour accounts for 14 per cent of people in forced labour...

### ***Forced marriage***

**An estimated 22 million people were living in forced marriage on any given day in 2021.** This indicates an increase of 6.6 million since the 2016 global estimates.

The true incidence of forced marriage, particularly involving children aged 16 and younger, is likely far greater than current estimates can capture; these are based on a narrow definition and do not include all child marriages. Child marriages are considered to be forced because a child cannot legally give consent to marry.

**Forced marriage is closely linked to long-established patriarchal attitudes and practices and is highly context specific.** The overwhelming majority of forced marriages (more than 85 per cent) was driven by family pressure. Although two-thirds (65 per cent) of forced marriages are found in Asia and the Pacific, when regional population size is considered, the prevalence is highest in the Arab States, with 4.8 people out of every 1,000 in the region in forced marriage.

### ***Migrants particularly vulnerable to forced labour***

Migrant workers are more than three times more likely to be in forced labour than non-migrant adult workers. While labour migration has a largely positive effect on individuals, households, communities and societies, this finding demonstrates how migrants are particularly vulnerable to forced labour and trafficking, whether because of irregular or poorly governed migration, or unfair and unethical recruitment practices.

"It is shocking that the situation of modern slavery is not improving. Nothing can justify the persistence of this fundamental abuse of human rights," said ILO Director-General, Guy Ryder. "We know what needs to be done, and we know it can be done. Effective national policies and regulation are fundamental. But governments cannot do this alone. International standards provide a sound basis, and an all-hands-on-deck approach is needed. Trade unions, employers' organizations, civil society and ordinary people all have critical roles to play."...

## **Human Rights/Responsibility to Protect – OAS**

### **[OAS Special Adviser on Responsibility to Protect Launches Report](#)**

September 15, 2022

The Organization of American States (OAS) Special Adviser on the Responsibility to Protect (R2P) Jared Genser today released a report that provides recommendations to the General Secretariat and the OAS as a whole on how to further work in the field of atrocity prevention and response. The report is guided by the feedback the Special Adviser received from consultations with 45 officials from 30 OAS Member States; 40 officials from different OAS organs, agencies, and entities; and 20 civil society and international organizations.

The 75-page report entitled "*The Responsibility to Protect and the Organization of American States: A Path Forward for Atrocity Prevention and Response in the Americas*" is issued under the mandate of the Special Adviser on the Responsibility to Protect, whose **main objective is to design a framework that will empower the Organization to better act to prevent and respond to mass atrocities in the region. As the first regional organization in the world to establish such a position, it has the unique opportunity to set a global standard** for regional engagement with R2P – the report intends to be a landmark step in that direction.

The report:

- :: Defines the principle of R2P, including explaining its origins and development, legal context, and options for implementation.

- :: Considers the context of R2P in the Americas, including the kind of regional support that exists for R2P today.

- :: Elaborates on the relationship between R2P and the OAS: legal frameworks, existing work of the OAS on human rights and conflict prevention, and the creation of the position of the OAS Special Adviser on R2P...

### **THE RESPONSIBILITY TO PROTECT AND THE ORGANIZATION OF AMERICAN STATES: A PATH FORWARD FOR ATROCITY PREVENTION AND RESPONSE IN THE AMERICAS**

Report of the General Secretariat of the Organization of American States

Washington, D.C., September 15, 2022

*Executive Summary* [Excerpt]

...The OAS has a long and distinguished history of advancing human rights and acting to prevent conflict. Yet, while the OAS has significant experience and expertise in these areas, it has comparatively little experience in the field of atrocity prevention. Deepening the Organization's engagement with atrocity prevention and response is a logical and important extension of its existing conflict prevention and human rights efforts.

**In May 2018, an OAS Panel of Independent International Experts found reasonable grounds that atrocity crimes were, in fact, taking place in one of its Member States, Venezuela.** In light of these findings, Secretary General Luis Almagro raised the question of the international community and the region's responsibility to prevent and respond to these abuses in the fall of that year, highlighting the unanimous approval of the 2005 World Summit Outcome. The OAS hosted its first dialogue on R2P in March 2019, and named Monika Le Roy as the Organization's first focal point on R2P to explore the role the Organization could play in supporting the principle.

**The creation of the position of Special Adviser on the Responsibility to Protect by Secretary General Luis Almagro in October 2020** presented a landmark opportunity for the OAS to build upon its existing efforts to prevent and respond to mass atrocities. As the first regional organization in the world to establish the position of a Special Adviser on the Responsibility to Protect, it also has the unique opportunity to set a global standard for regional engagement with R2P. As noted by Secretary General Almagro in the press release from the OAS announcing the

appointment of Jared Genser as the first Special Adviser:

*Going back to our founding, the OAS has sought to secure peace, justice, and human rights for the people of the Americas. Yet, over time, there have been many mass atrocities committed in far too many countries by repressive and undemocratic regimes. One need look no further than the crimes against humanity being committed today, which come from a deliberate, methodical, and systematic strategy, to understand the consequences of our failure to act together.<sup>1</sup>*

Thus, the main objective of this mandate has been to design a framework that will empower the Organization to better act to prevent and respond to mass atrocities in the region. There are a number of policy proposals – focusing on the prevention of mass atrocities – that would dramatically enhance the Organization’s capabilities to do so.

**This report is designed to provide a common foundation for understanding how the Organization of American States can deepen its work in the field of atrocity prevention and response.** Importantly, it is strongly informed and guided by the feedback the Special Adviser received from his wide consultations with 45 officials from 30 OAS Member States; 40 officials from different OAS organs, agencies, and entities; and 20 civil society and international organizations.

...**The report ultimately makes three recommendations**, which will be elaborated upon more fully later:

**First, the General Secretariat could support the creation of an early-warning mechanism**, coordinated by the Special Adviser, to ensure states and other OAS organs are proactively informed about situations of concern as they arise, along with recommendations for their consideration.

**Second, Member States could commit to having an annual dialogue in the OAS General Assembly about the responsibility to protect in the region**, modeled on the annual Interactive Dialogue on the Responsibility to Protect that takes place at the UN General Assembly. This dialogue could both be focused on discussing regional implementation and ensuring complementarity with UN efforts on R2P.

**And third, the Organization could affirm its commitment to R2P through a Permanent Council or General Assembly resolution.** Of course, it will be up to the permanent representatives of Member States to decide if they wanted to propose and seek the adoption of such a resolution.

No one should suffer from mass atrocity crimes. With more than a century of experience in regional collaboration, our hemisphere has developed a robust tradition of defending human rights. **But recent years have demonstrated the serious gaps in our existing regional protection mechanisms. R2P provides a framework to fill those gaps and to empower the Organization to protect against these most serious human rights violations.** While all hope that mass atrocity crimes will never again take place in the region, by recommitting the Organization to atrocity prevention and advancing these initiatives – centered around prevention and early warning – the OAS can do a much better job protecting vulnerable populations throughout the Americas for years to come.

## [Japan and World Bank Host IDA20 Launch; Global Community Consolidates Commitment to the Poorest with \\$93 Billion Package](#)

TOKYO, Sept. 13, 2022 –The Government of Japan and the World Bank hosted the in-person launch of the twentieth cycle of the International Development Association (IDA20) at a gathering of donor and recipient countries.

**The \$93 billion IDA20 package will help low-income countries rebuild their economies in the face of overlapping crises—climate change, COVID-19, conflict, inflation, rising debt, and food insecurity—which are hitting the poorest people disproportionately harder.**

...“The historic agreement of IDA20 represents our unwavering willingness to help developing nations achieve development goals,” said Shunichi Suzuki, Japan’s Minister of Finance. “As the international community faces multiple crises, we are convinced that cooperating with one another and sharing knowledge and experience are the wisdom that humanity has acquired through its history, and IDA will play an even more important role as the World Bank Group and international community work together.”

### **IDA20 will help countries tackle these challenges by:**

- **Prioritizing investments in human capital** such as education, health and nutrition, and COVID-19 vaccines;
- **Strengthening resilience of food systems and providing emergency support.** IDA20 will support agriculture and social protection systems to increase food production and help families cushion the effects of higher food prices;
- **Deepening support to prepare for future crises,** including pandemics, financial shocks and natural hazards;
- **Enhancing action on climate change,** including actions to support adaptation, preserve biodiversity, and enable countries to shift to a low-GHG emissions development pathway with a just transition;
- **Providing increased and flexible support for countries facing fragility and conflict;** and
- **Implementing a debt policy to promote sustainable borrowing and lending practices** in IDA countries.

...The \$93 billion package was made possible by donor contributions from 52 high- and middle-income countries totaling \$23.5 billion, with additional financing raised in the capital markets, repayments, and the World Bank’s own contributions.

### [COVID-19: the case for prosociality](#)

The *Lancet Commission* on lessons for the future from the COVID-19 pandemic, published on Sept 15, **lays bare what has been nothing less than a massive global failure—a failure of rationality, transparency, norms of public health practice, operational coordination, and international solidarity.**



The Commission shows that national governments were too slow and too cautious in their response to the outbreak of SARS-CoV-2. They paid too little attention to the most vulnerable groups in society. Their responses were hampered by low public trust and an epidemic of misinformation and disinformation. The result was millions of preventable deaths and a reversal in progress towards sustainable development for many countries. **A multilateral system developed after the World War 2 did not hold up to a modern pandemic. Global collaboration and solidarity were good in business and science but poor in politics and international relations.**

**The Commission proposes five pillars that are essential in fighting emerging infectious diseases: prevention, containment, health services, equity, and global innovation and diffusion.**

To achieve these pillars the Commission argues that **governments, regulators, and institutions must be reoriented toward society as a whole, rather than the interests of individuals—a concept the Commissioners call prosocialty.** Without this shift, the world is vulnerable and unable to tackle effectively any global threat.

**The Commission gives recommendations in three main areas.**

**First, practical steps to finally control and understand the COVID-19 pandemic,** such as a vaccination strategy that is sustainable and not just reactive, with the goal of protecting populations.

**Second, realistic, feasible, and necessary investments** to improve the first line of defense in countries by strengthening health systems and widening universal health coverage.

**Third, ambitious proposals to ignite a renaissance in multilateralism,** integrating the global response to the risk of future pandemics with actions to address the climate crisis and reversals in sustainable development. In this way, the Commission boldly sets out a vision of a different future, defined by a properly financed and better-prepared global architecture that is driven by cooperation and shared responsibility rather than globalised profit-seeking.

The Commission began with a task force on the origins of the pandemic. But, regrettably, the divisive public discussion about the source of SARS-CoV-2 damaged the trust needed for the task force to complete its work. This Commission therefore has no additional new evidence to contribute to the ongoing investigation of the pandemic's origins. The recommendation to intensify the search for the source of the pandemic is an urgent plea for countries to strengthen cooperation to elucidate the causes of this catastrophe. This will aid the prevention of future pandemics. Some Commissioners have come under unprecedented attack and pressure as a result of their work. The Lancet thanks them for their time and dedication to scientific enquiry.

There have been an estimated 17·7 million excess deaths due to COVID-19 globally, and this number is likely to be an underestimate. The number of reported new weekly cases decreased or remained stable across all six WHO regions. However, many countries have reduced their surveillance, causing uncertainty about the true number. **Surveillance and testing capacity must be safeguarded and rescaled to prepare for potentially increasing numbers during winter in the northern hemisphere. Japan, South Korea, Australia, Chile, and parts of Europe such as Greece continue to have very high numbers of new cases.** The risk of new variants remains elevated and there are uncertainties around the strength and duration of immunity from vaccination. But perhaps most importantly, as many countries and institutions try to find a path out of the pandemic, many questions about what went wrong and how future pandemics can be prevented remain unanswered.

**The war in Ukraine and climate and economic instability have diverted attention away from COVID-19.** But as the Commission demonstrates, reassessing and strengthening global institutions and multilateralism will not only benefit the response to COVID-19 and future pandemics but also to any crisis that has global ramifications. The release of The Lancet Commission on COVID-19 offers the best opportunity to insist that the failures and lessons from the past 3 years are not wasted but are constructively used to build more resilient health systems and stronger political systems that support the health and wellbeing of people and planet during the 21st century.

### **The Lancet Commission on lessons for the future from the COVID-19 pandemic**

#### **Executive summary** *[Editor's text bolding; selective formatting for clarity]*

As of May 31, 2022, there were 6·9 million reported deaths and 17·2 million estimated deaths from COVID-19, as reported by the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME; throughout the report, we rely on IHME estimates of infections and deaths; note that the IHME gives an estimated range, and we refer to the mean estimate). **This staggering death toll is both a profound tragedy and a massive global failure at multiple levels. Too many governments have failed to adhere to basic norms of institutional rationality and transparency, too many people—often influenced by misinformation—have disrespected and protested against basic public health precautions, and the world's major powers have failed to collaborate to control the pandemic.**

The multiple failures of international cooperation include

- (1) the lack of timely notification of the initial outbreak of COVID-19;
- (2) costly delays in acknowledging the crucial airborne exposure pathway of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, and in implementing appropriate measures at national and global levels to slow the spread of the virus;
- (3) the lack of coordination among countries regarding suppression strategies;
- (4) the failure of governments to examine evidence and adopt best practices for controlling the pandemic and managing economic and social spillovers from other countries;
- (5) the shortfall of global funding for low-income and middle-income countries (LMICs), as classified by the World Bank;
- (6) the failure to ensure adequate global supplies and equitable distribution of key commodities—including protective gear, diagnostics, medicines, medical devices, and vaccines—especially for LMICs;
- (7) the lack of timely, accurate, and systematic data on infections, deaths, viral variants, health system responses, and indirect health consequences;

- (8) the poor enforcement of appropriate levels of biosafety regulations in the lead-up to the pandemic, raising the possibility of a laboratory-related outbreak;
- (9) the failure to combat systematic disinformation; and
- (10) the lack of global and national safety nets to protect populations experiencing vulnerability.

**This Commission report aims to contribute to a new era of multilateral cooperation based on strong UN institutions to reduce the dangers of COVID-19, forestall the next pandemic, and enable the world to achieve the agreed goals of sustainable development, human rights, and peace that governments are committed to pursue as members of the UN.** We address this Commission report to the UN member states, the UN agencies and multilateral institutions, and multilateral processes such as the G20 and the G7. Our aim is to propose guideposts for strengthening the multilateral system to address global emergencies and to achieve sustainable development. In issuing this report, we commend the excellent work of many important international studies that have preceded our own, most notably those from the Independent Panel for Pandemic Preparedness and Response and the G20 High-Level Independent Panel on Financing the Global Commons on Pandemic Preparedness and Response.

Section 1 of this Commission report provides a conceptual framework for understanding pandemics. Section 2 provides an annotated chronology of the COVID-19 pandemic and thematic findings regarding several issues. Section 3 presents our policy recommendations, particularly around multilateral cooperation centred at WHO to address global health crises, and around investments in preparedness for future health crises through strong national health systems and international financing and technology cooperation with the world's lower-income regions.

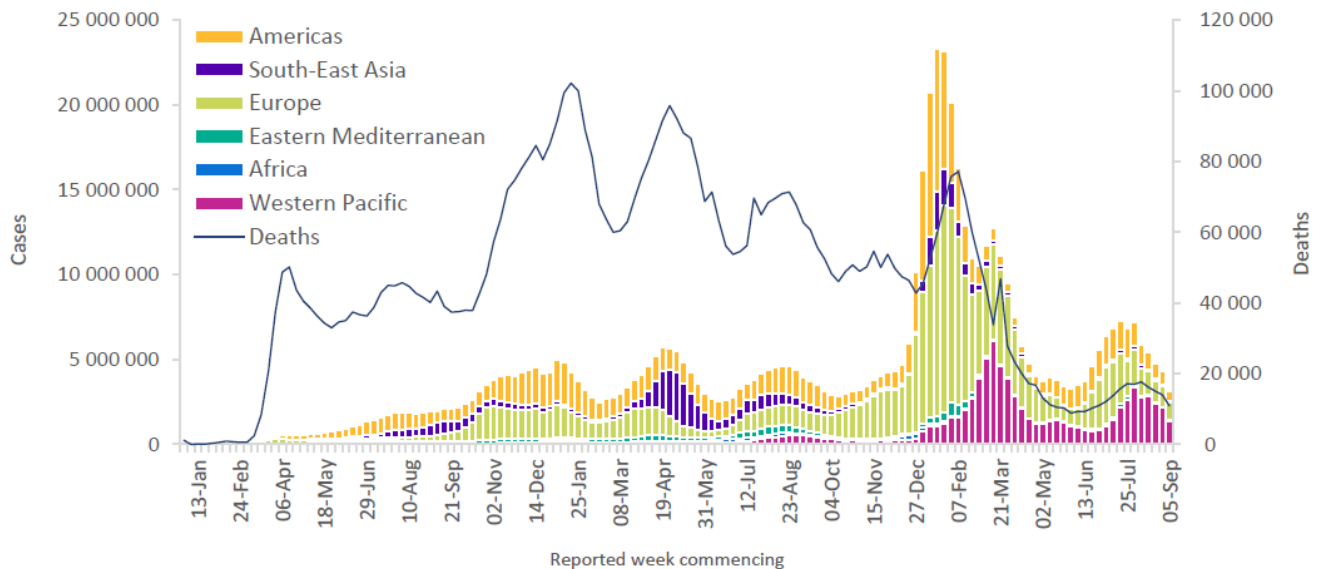
## Weekly epidemiological update on COVID-19 - 14 September 2022

### Overview

Globally, the number of new weekly cases decreased by 28% during the week of 5 to 11 September 2022, as compared to the previous week, with over 3.1 million new cases reported. The number of new weekly deaths decreased by 22%, as compared to the previous week, with over 11 000 fatalities reported.

As of 11 September 2022, 605 million confirmed cases and 6.4 million deaths have been reported globally.

## ***PHEIC*** **Polio**

[Polio this week as of 07 Sep 2022 - GPEI](#)

:: Following the isolation of vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (VDPV2) in New York, USA, in July, further virological and epidemiological analysis confirms circulation of this strain. It is important to note that since initial isolation of VDPV2, local and national public health authorities have already been operating on the assumption that this strain is circulating, and as such, this official classification at this time does not affect the operational response. New York and US public health authorities continue to implement a timely and appropriate response to this circulating VDPV2 (cVDPV2), in order to rapidly interrupt its circulation, including by: continuing to intensify surveillance efforts (including for potential cases of paralysis), identifying population sub-groups/areas with potential immunity gaps, and proactively reaching out to communities with known immunity gaps to strengthen vaccination coverage.

:: A WPV1-positive environmental sample is this week reported from greater Karachi, Sindh, with collection date on 23 August, linked to WPV1 from southern Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Detection of virus in Karachi is not unexpected, given the large-scale and frequent population movements between Karachi and the rest of the country, in particular Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

:: In the Democratic Republic of Congo, circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 1 (cVDPV1) has been confirmed. The country is also co-infected with cVDPV2 and is continuing to conduct response to urgently stop both strains.

#### **[United States confirmed as country with circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus](#)**

September 13, 2022

CDC today announced that polioviruses found in New York, both from the case of paralytic polio in an unvaccinated adult in Rockland County and in several wastewater samples from communities near the patient's residence, meet the World Health Organization (WHO)'s criteria for circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus (cVDPV) – meaning that poliovirus continues to be transmitted in Rockland County, NY, and surrounding areas.

CDC is working closely with WHO, the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), and other international public health partner organizations. As previously reported, the virus' genetic sequences from the patient from Rockland County, NY, and wastewater specimens collected in New York have been linked to wastewater samples in Jerusalem, Israel, and London, UK, indicating community transmission. The viral sequences from the patient and from three wastewater specimens had enough genetic changes to meet the definition of a vaccine-derived poliovirus (VDPV). These two things – one

individual with VDPV and at least one detection of a related VDPV in an environmental sample – meet WHO's definition of cVDPV, and CDC submitted this data to WHO for inclusion on its list of countries with cVDPV. There are global recommendations for countries with cVDPV2 outbreaks to protect people from polio, and the United States is taking all appropriate actions to prevent new cases of paralysis.

The United States now joins a list of about 30 other countries where cVDPVs have been identified. Circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus occurs when local immunity to poliovirus is low enough to allow prolonged transmission of the original weakened virus in the oral polio vaccine. As the virus circulates and more genetic changes occur, the virus can regain its ability to infect the central nervous system and cause paralysis. It's important to note that cVDPVs are not caused by a child receiving the polio vaccine. Oral polio vaccine has not been used or licensed in the U.S. since 2000 but continues to be used in some countries...

As part of the Rockefeller Foundation's 100 Resilient Cities (100RC) program, close to 100 cities around the world developed resilience strategies that were intended to holistically address threats to residents' well-being and cities' abilities to prosper. This meant not just adapting to or mitigating physical climate change-induced threats, but also addressing underlying social and economic stressors such as poverty, a shrinking workforce, or social inequities. Although most cities addressed multiple domains of resilience, not every city was able to move from theory—discussing and understanding how these issues intersect—to actually implementing holistic resilience-building projects. This brief draws from data collected during the Urban Institute's five-year monitoring and evaluation of urban resilience-building activities. If you're a professional caregiver in the US with colleagues paid a minimum wage, their labor is valued so little that it would be a crime to pay them less. The US Federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 requires employers under its jurisdiction to pay workers at least a federal minimum wage. #### *Abstract*

In times of crisis, working equids can play a pivotal role in supporting vulnerable people in lower middle income countries. However, their contributions are rarely acknowledged in academic research, media reporting, international policy, and development initiatives. ## **A hybrid 3D object auto-completion approach with self-supervised data augmentation for fragments of archaeological objects**

### *Abstract*

It is a common case that archaeological finds are frequently found in fragments and cannot always be reassembled in their entirety. Additionally, the completion of their shape and volume is sometimes costly and occasionally requires a lot of manual work, in particular for exhibition purposes. As a first step, improving the geometry of the fragments could potentially help the archaeological conservators in the assembling process. In this direction, in this paper we propose an end-to-end hybrid approach (i.e. point clouds to benefit from the limited complexity and creating results in mesh benefiting from their visualization capabilities) for the digital auto-completion of fragmented archaeological artifacts with missing parts in combination with a novel self-supervised data augmentation scheme in order to address a significant limitation in the archaeological domain (i.e. limited available observations and absence of the complete object). Our approach uses only 5 fragments of a partly preserved archaeological object for training. As a first step, an object (i.e artifact fragment) in mesh representation is converted to point cloud, from which more fragments of the incomplete original object are artificially generated, with the help of 3D surfaces, to augment the dataset. This dataset is then passed in a GAN-based Cascaded refinement network for generating a complete output, which is, finally, converted back to a mesh. Our experiments showed that the proposed hybrid approach, can be successfully used to complete and restore the geometry of a partly preserved archaeological object without having ever seen the complete form of it. However, due to the complexity of the fragments, such methods in most cases cannot generate their fine decorative and surface details.

### **COVID-19 in Africa: Underreporting, demographic effect, chaotic dynamics, and mitigation strategy impact**

#### *Abstract*

The epidemic of COVID-19 has shown different developments in Africa compared to the other continents. Three different approaches were used in this study to analyze this situation. In the first part, basic statistics were performed to estimate the contribution of the elderly people to the total numbers of cases and deaths in comparison to the other continents; Similarly, the health systems capacities were analysed to assess the level of underreporting. In the second part, differential equations were reconstructed from the epidemiological time series of cases and deaths (from the John Hopkins University) to analyse the dynamics of COVID-19 in seventeen countries. In the third part, the time evolution of the contact number was reconstructed since the beginning of the outbreak to investigate the effectiveness of the mitigation strategies. Results were compared to the Oxford stringency index and to the mobility indices of the Google Community Mobility Reports.

Compared to Europe, the analyses show that the lower proportion of elderly people in Africa enables to explain the lower total numbers of cases and deaths by a factor of 5.1 on average (from 1.9 to 7.8). It corresponds to a genuine effect. Nevertheless, COVID-19 numbers are effectively largely underestimated in Africa by a factor of 8.5 on average (from 1.7 to 20. and more) due to the weakness of the health systems at country level. Geographically, the models obtained for the dynamics of cases and deaths reveal very diversified dynamics. The dynamics is chaotic in many contexts, including a situation of bistability rarely observed in dynamical systems. Finally, the contact number directly deduced from the epidemiological observations reveals an effective role of the mitigation strategies on the short term. On the long term, control measures have contributed to maintain the epidemic at a low level although the progressive release of the stringency did not produce a clear increase of the contact number. The arrival of the omicron variant is clearly detected and characterised by a quick increase of interpeople contact, for most of the African countries considered in the analysis.

#### *Author summary*

In this study, we show (1) that two main factors can explain the lower numbers of cases and deaths per inhabitants in Africa: an underestimation (by a factor 8.5) of the reported cases and deaths which directly results from the under capacities of the health systems at country level, but also a genuine effect by a factor 5.1 directly resulting from the smaller fraction of elderly people. We demonstrate (2) that the dynamics of the epidemic can be approximated deterministically by few variables only. Its time evolution is however highly sensitive to the initial conditions which makes it unpredictable at long term. Moreover, dynamics can largely vary from one country to another. For one country (Ghana), it is shown that very different epidemiological evolution can occur under strictly identical sanitary conditions. Finally, we reveal (3) that the impact of the control measures on the contact number is effective at short term and enabled to maintain the epidemic at a relatively low level, but it is more difficult to identify distinctly the long-term role of mitigation strategy. The omicron variant is very clearly detected in the recent evolution of the epidemic.

In total, attacks claimed the lives of 1,307 and wounded 4,201 persons. Though fewer in number, attacks against music venues were responsible for 29.4% of fatalities and 35.0% of those wounded, and more frequently involved the use of firearms. Among 95 attacks falling within the highest quartile for victims killed or wounded (>two killed and/or >ten wounded), 83 (87.4%) involved explosives, seven (7.4%) involved firearms, and three (3.2%) involved incendiary methods.
