The World Disasters Report 2026 warns harmful information as a de facto humanitarian crisis - undermining access to aid, eroding trust, destabilizing social cohesion and increasing risks for staff, volunteers and communities. No longer a peripheral communications issue, harmful information is an operational and strategic challenge affecting acceptance, safety and principled humanitarian action.

As the **IFRC’s flagship publication, the Report brings together insights from nearly 100 contributors, 60 organizations including over 30 National Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies.** Grounded in experiences from across regions and community insights, it examines how harmful information, including misinformation, disinformation and dehumanizing narratives, impacts responses to disasters, public health emergencies, migration and conflict.

Across eight chapters, the Report shows why understanding harms of harmful information is critical — revealing its wide-ranging impacts and how it disrupts preparedness, response and recovery. It provides practical recommendations to strengthen information resilience, safeguard humanitarian principles and rebuild trust.

In an era where information can determine access, safety and dignity, the World Disasters Report 2026 offers both the evidence and a roadmap for action.

[IFRC warns harmful information is putting lives at risk during crises](#)

Geneva, 5 March 2026 – Harmful information is undermining life-saving humanitarian action at a time when disasters are affecting more people, more often, according to the World Disasters Report 2026, released today by the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC).

Between 2020 and 2024, disasters affected nearly 700 million people, caused more than 105 million displacements, and claimed over 270,000 lives – with the number of people in need of humanitarian assistance more than doubling (INFORM Severity index).

The World Disasters Report 2026 **warns that harmful information and dehumanising narratives are increasingly undermining trust, putting the lives of humanitarian workers and**

communities at risk. In polarized and politically charged contexts, humanitarian principles such as neutrality and impartiality are increasingly misunderstood, misrepresented or deliberately attacked online.

Drawing on evidence from crises across the world, **the report emphasises that trust has become one of the most critical, and fragile, assets in humanitarian action.**

Jagan Chapagain, IFRC Secretary General, said: "In every crisis I have witnessed, **information is as essential as food, water and shelter. But when information is false, misleading or deliberately manipulated, it can deepen fear, obstruct humanitarian access and cost lives.**"

Global examples of harmful information in action:

- **Spain:** During floods in Valencia, false narratives online accused the Spanish Red Cross of diverting aid to migrants, fuelling xenophobic attacks on volunteers.
- **South Sudan:** Rumours that humanitarian agencies were distributing poisoned food caused people to avoid life-saving aid and led to threats against local Red Cross staff, temporarily disrupting operations.
- **Lebanon:** Overlapping crises saw false claims that volunteers were spreading COVID-19, favouring certain groups in aid distribution, or providing unsafe cholera vaccines, eroding trust and endangering vulnerable communities.
- **Bangladesh:** Despite delivering first aid and assistance across multiple districts during a period of political unrest, volunteers faced widespread accusations of inaction and political alignment, leading to harassment and long-term reputational damage...

The World Disasters Report 2026 calls on governments, technology companies, humanitarian agencies, communities and local actors to recognise that trustworthy information is a matter of life and death.

Recommendations include:

- **Technology platforms:** Prioritise authoritative information from trusted humanitarian, health and local actors in crisis contexts. Provide low-bandwidth, multilingual, and locally relevant tools and transparently moderate harmful content.
- **States and policymakers:** Invest in evidence-based regulation and support local data systems that monitor crises and harmful information, strengthening transparency, accountability and an environment that enables principled humanitarian action.
- **Humanitarian agencies:** Embed harmful information preparedness into humanitarian operations as a core function, with trained teams, standardised tools, predictive analytics, and strong community engagement to anticipate, detect, and respond to harmful narratives.
- **Communities and local actors:** Act as trusted messengers, support digital and media literacy, participate in rumour tracking, and ensure local perspectives shape responses to safeguard access and trust – recognising that communities are central to the solution...



Health Data Governance

Abstract

It can take many years for evidence generated in research to influence health care guidelines (1).

Meanwhile, the vast data collected during everyday life, particularly during engagement with the health care system, remain largely untapped for public health, precision medicine, postmarket safety, and real-time decision-making (2, 3). **These “real-world data” (RWD) remain fragmented, proprietary, noninteroperable, and inconsistently governed.** Although some approaches to RWD have demonstrated value in limited settings, their impact has remained constrained by uneven incentives, voluntary compliance, and the absence of routine auditability of data access and use.

To address this, health data should be governed through federated, standards-based, community-driven models that reflect their public benefit, empower patients and communities, and foster public trust and participation. To help achieve these goals, we propose governing health data as essential infrastructure by using public utility models, defined by their public good, distributed stewardship, and public oversight.

Box 1.

Balancing data regulation and ownership

Trade-offs must be balanced when considering real-world data governance and structure. How these are best balanced will vary by situation.

BENEFITS: INDIVIDUAL VERSUS PUBLIC

Personal returns build trust and agency but add cost and complexity; population focus scales impact but can feel distant unless the individuals see tangible benefit. Indicators and best practices: return of results, plain-language summaries, access logs, dynamic consent, and public benefit reporting. Metrics include time to diagnosis, signal detection speed, equity, and reproducibility.

GOVERNANCE: INCLUDE VERSUS REGULATE

Bottom-up participation ensures buy-in and real-world relevance but is more variable; top-down authority leads to more uniformity (content and usage policy) but can miss frontline needs. Indicators and best practices: a chartered health data utility commission, participatory rule-making, funding support, audits, penalties, anti-blocking policies, and independent scorecards.

TECHNICAL INFRASTRUCTURE: FEDERATE VERSUS CENTRALIZE

Federation preserves local control and minimizes blast radius but limits some analytical methods, especially those involving rare events and diseases; centralization improves data quality and uniformity but concentrates risk and power. Indicators and best practices: trusted hubs, metadata provenance, differential privacy, shared services (IDs and vocabularies), and rapid incident response.

PRIVACY AND SECURITY: PROTECT VERSUS STEWARD

Strict protection minimizes misuse but can throttle access and learning; stewardship benefits community but raises exposure and demands strong safeguards. Indicators and best practices: data minimization, zero-trust architecture, privacy-enhancing technologies (PETs) [such as secure enclaves (14) and federated learning 15)], transparency dashboards, bias testing, and equity impact reviews.

STANDARDS: STANDARDIZE VERSUS INNOVATE

Standardization assures interoperability and lowers cost but can slow change; innovation speeds improvement but risks fragmentation and technical debt. Indicators and best practices: FHIR/USCDI-Core, open reference implementations, version control, and international alignment.

FAIRNESS: SERVE PUBLIC GOOD VERSUS ENCOURAGE PRIVATE INVESTMENT

Public-good priority secures equity and transparency but may limit capital; accommodating

private investment unlocks scale and speed but needs guardrails against rent-seeking and exclusion. Indicators and best practices: pricing caps, equitable access, small-organization waivers, benefit sharing, standardized agreements, and conflict-of-interest disclosure.



UN Independent International Scientific Panel on AI

Amid Rising Global Tensions, Secretary-General Urges Trusted Scientific Guidance on Artificial Intelligence, in Remarks to Independent International Panel

Following are UN Secretary-General António Guterres' remarks to the virtual first meeting of the Independent International Scientific Panel on AI (artificial intelligence), held today:

Welcome — and **my warm congratulations on your appointment by the General Assembly** — and on the responsibility that comes with it. You have my profound gratitude for accepting this task.

I recently returned from the AI Impact Summit in India, where I had the opportunity to meet some of you. And in conversation after conversation — with leaders and innovators — I felt real excitement about the Panel. **The world is looking to you for clarity. It is a huge responsibility. It is also an historic one.** And I have no doubt that you are up to it.

Individually, you come from diverse regions and disciplines, bringing outstanding expertise in AI and related fields. **Collectively, you represent something the world has never seen before. A first-of-its-kind, one-of-a-kind, global, independent scientific body dedicated to helping shape the trajectory of artificial intelligence for the benefit of humanity** — while there is still time. And that is the operative word: time.

When I mentioned “artificial intelligence” in my first address to the opening of the General Assembly in 2017, only two other world leaders even uttered the term. Today, AI is advancing at lightning speed — reshaping economies and societies. And for those who think we are moving too fast, I would only say that never in the future will we move as slow as we are moving now. We are indeed in a high level of acceleration.

No country, no company and no field of research can see the full picture alone because today **AI is reshaping economies and societies. As an engineer, I share your conviction that science and facts matter. And as a longtime politician and diplomat, I have seen how quickly fear can take hold when facts are missing or distorted — how trust breaks down and division deepens.**

The world urgently needs a shared, global understanding of artificial intelligence; grounded not in ideology, but in science; not in fake news, but in knowledge. That is where you come in.

Your role is to bring independent, credible science into the global conversation — and to do so at a time when geopolitical tensions are rising, conflicts are raging and the stakes for safe and responsible AI could not be greater. In this fractured context, an unbiased and trusted understanding of AI is essential.

Your mandate is intentionally broad — spanning from frontier systems to the impacts already unfolding across societies and economies. AI will shape peace and security, human rights and sustainable development, the three areas of intervention of the United Nations for decades to

come. Your work will help decision-makers move from competing claims to shared facts — and from shared facts to workable solutions: Building effective guardrails, unlocking innovation for the common good and strengthening international cooperation.

Like AI itself, this Panel is in a race against time. **In the span of a few months, you will establish your working methods; set priorities, form focused working groups and deliver a substantive, evidence-based assessment.**

This work will inform the first annual Global Dialogue on AI Governance — co-chaired by Egriselda López of El Salvador and Rein Tammsaar of Estonia, who will join us today. Your first report will be a reference point for that Dialogue — and it will set the standard for what follows.

You are not starting from zero. Before you, the UN High-Level Advisory Body on AI demonstrated that despite differences of perspective and approach, it was possible to produce clear and concrete recommendations — including the creation of this very Panel. Their work was policy-oriented. Yours is scientific — a disciplined foundation that others can build on.

Let me underscore one final point: all members serve in their personal capacity — providing scientific assessments independent of any Government, company or institution, including the United Nations. **Grounded in conflict-of-interest safeguards, this scientific independence will help ensure that the Panel’s advice remains impartial and trusted...**

Once again, thank you for stepping forward at this decisive moment. I can think of no more important assignment for our world today.

Cognitive Warfare; “Military AI Agents”

Cognitive warfare has emerged as a central feature of modern conflict, yet it remains inconsistently defined and difficult to evaluate. Existing approaches often treat cognitive operations as a subset of information operations, limiting the ability to assess cognitive attacker-defender interactions or determine when advantage has been achieved. This article proposes a unified definition of cognitive warfare, introduces an interaction framework grounded in the OODA loop, and identifies measurable attributes associated with cognitive superiority. To illustrate the use of the framework, a notional case study demonstrates how these concepts can be applied to assess cognitive attacks and defenses in a contested environment. Thus, the framework provides joint force leaders and analysts with a practical foundation for understanding, comparing, and evaluating cognitive warfare campaigns.

Agentic AI systems - capable of goal interpretation, world modeling, planning, tool use, long-horizon operation, and autonomous coordination - introduce distinct control failures not addressed by existing safety frameworks. We identify six agentic governance failures tied to these capabilities and show how they erode meaningful human control in military settings. We propose the Agentic Military AI Governance Framework (AMAGF), a measurable architecture structured around three pillars: Preventive

Governance (reducing failure likelihood), Detective Governance (real-time detection of control degradation), and Corrective Governance (restoring or safely degrading operations). Its core mechanism, the Control Quality Score (CQS), is a composite real-time metric quantifying human control and enabling graduated responses as control weakens. For each failure type, we define concrete mechanisms, assign responsibilities across five institutional actors, and formalize evaluation metrics. A worked operational scenario illustrates implementation, and we situate the framework within established agent safety literature. We argue that governance must move from a binary conception of control to a continuous model in which control quality is actively measured and managed throughout the operational lifecycle.

AMMAN, 5 March 2026 —, "UNICEF is deeply concerned about the deadly impact the ongoing military escalation in Iran is having on children. Pharmacoepidemiology aims to appraise and understand the use and effects — both beneficial and adverse — of medicines in real-world settings. As such it can be considered a bridge science, linking clinical pharmacology, epidemiology, public health and the social sciences.

Medicines are public health tools. With regard to the quality and transparency of the assessment of their effectiveness and safety, they are increasingly subject to the expectations and requirements of patients, healthcare professionals and regulators. Those involved in the development and delivery of medicines must therefore take full account of the aforementioned paradigm shifts. Additionally, the arrival of novel therapeutic agents, such as gene therapy, biologics and mRNA vaccines, whose modes of action and interactions with living organisms have very little in common with those of the more traditional chemical medicines, has brought into question the classic elements of pharmacovigilance and pharmacoepidemiology, such as the dose–effect relationship, drug causation criteria and the determination of drug exposure.

Whether lawful or unlawful, death is an inherent part of war– and has been throughout history. Each of the four 1949 Geneva Conventions contains rules addressing this topic quite extensively, as do their Additional Protocols and customary IHL, both for international and non-international armed conflicts. Yet, until now, the IHL rules on the protection of the dead have received relatively little attention in scholarship. The ambition behind this edition of the Review is to remedy this gap, with a focus on contemporary wartime realities and humanitarian responses, including by the International Committee of the Red Cross. This edition also seeks to address how international human rights law and international criminal law can complement the protection of those who have died as a result of armed conflicts. Many contributions in this edition equally reflect on the deeper layers of ethics, values, culture and religion underpinning the legal rules. By treating the dead, no matter who they were in life, in a dignified manner, parties to an armed conflict contribute to upholding humanity in war. Ultimately, doing so may help to build trust and find pathways to peace between those who have inflicted death upon each other during war.

Cognitive warfare has emerged as a central feature of modern conflict, yet it remains inconsistently defined and difficult to evaluate. Existing approaches often treat cognitive operations as a subset of information operations, limiting the ability to assess cognitive attacker-defender interactions or determine when advantage has been achieved. This article proposes a unified definition of cognitive warfare, introduces an interaction framework grounded in the OODA loop, and identifies measurable attributes associated with cognitive superiority. To illustrate the use of the framework, a notional case study demonstrates how these concepts can be applied to assess cognitive attacks and defenses in a contested environment. Thus, the framework provides joint force leaders and analysts with a practical foundation for understanding, comparing, and evaluating cognitive warfare campaigns.

Agentic AI systems - capable of goal interpretation, world modeling, planning, tool use, long-horizon operation, and autonomous coordination - introduce distinct control failures not addressed by existing safety frameworks. We identify six agentic governance failures tied to these capabilities and show how they erode meaningful human control in military settings. We propose the Agentic Military AI Governance Framework (AMAGF), a measurable architecture structured around three pillars: Preventive Governance (reducing failure likelihood), Detective Governance (real-time detection of control degradation), and Corrective Governance (restoring or safely degrading operations). Its core mechanism, the Control Quality Score (CQS), is a composite real-time metric quantifying human control and enabling graduated responses as control weakens. For each failure type, we define concrete mechanisms, assign responsibilities across five institutional actors, and formalize evaluation metrics. A worked operational

scenario illustrates implementation, and we situate the framework within established agent safety literature. We argue that governance must move from a binary conception of control to a continuous model in which control quality is actively measured and managed throughout the operational lifecycle.

[The Invisibility Hypothesis: Promises of AGI and the Future of the Global South](#)

Discussions surrounding Artificial General Intelligence have largely focused on technical feasibility, timelines, and existential risk, often treating its social impact as being the same across different populations. Less attention has been paid to how advanced AI systems may interact with existing global inequalities. This paper examines the implications of AGI for people in the Global South, arguing that the availability of highly autonomous, general-purpose cognitive systems does not guarantee equitable outcomes. We establish that, as scientific discovery, economic coordination, and governance become increasingly automated, the relevance of human individuals may become conditional on access to infrastructure, institutional inclusion, and geopolitical circumstances rather than skills or intelligence. Under this setting, the Global South faces different pathways: in the best case, geographic location is no longer relevant as AGI fully democratizes access to knowledge and essential services for everyone in the globe; in the worst case, existing structural constraints are severely amplified, rendering already marginalized populations not merely economically invisible, but functionally irrelevant to global systems. We ground this analysis in empirical signals from contemporary AI deployment and extend to potential trajectories, highlighting both risk and opportunity pathways for Latin America, Africa, and South Asia.

Addressing community health issues requires an integration of community-driven initiatives with more traditional academic research. The CBPR approach facilitated a comprehensive assessment, the implementation of context-specific interventions, and engagement with and empowering of communities related to care seeking. ...The Declaration of Taipei tries to achieve a balance between the rights of individuals giving their tissue or data for research and other purposes based on confidentiality and privacy rules while at the same time recognising that health data has become a very powerful tool for increasing knowledge.

In analysing the scenarios that already exist for the use (and misuse) of health data and biobanks, we came to the conclusion that the major risk scenarios may not result from science, but from the commercial, administrative or political use of such data. Limiting our guidelines to research only would have left us blind to the imminent risk of abuse from outside the field of medicine: commercialization, cost-cutting and potential political abuse.

Therefore, in contrast to the Declaration of Helsinki, this policy aims to address any use of health databases and biobanks excluding individual treatment and is not restricted to research. As physicians are the primary custodians of confidential health information, they feel an obligation towards their patients and other persons who entrust them with their data and specimens...

In April 2025, the WMA appointed a workgroup to initiate the revision process of this document. To encourage as much global participation in the revision process as possible, the WMA is collaborating with its members to host a series of regional meetings...
