**The world is facing a paradox. While wealth and technological advancement continue to expand, so do inequality, discrimination, and conflict. Public discourse is increasingly shaped by polarization, hate speech, racism, and misogyny.**

At the same time, long-term global challenges — from the climate crisis to the unchecked development of powerful technologies — compete for attention in an increasingly fragmented world. Against this backdrop, UN Human Rights spent 2025 working tirelessly to ensure that human rights remain both a guiding principle and a practical tool for change.

The newly released [Annual Report 2025](#) highlights examples of that effort and the lives transformed through human rights action globally. “It sets out the many concrete ways in which we provide a lifeline for the abused, amplify the voices of the silenced, and stand with those who risk everything to defend the rights of others,” said UN Human Rights Chief Volker Türk.

Türk also added that UN Human Rights stepped up reform efforts to be closer to the people that the Office serves and better respond to their needs. These achievements were delivered amid a wider UN financial crisis. Despite these constraints, ongoing reforms helped ensure continued progress and enabled the results highlighted in this report.

*Human rights as a lifeline*

**For millions of people facing violence, discrimination, detention, and exclusion, human rights are not abstract ideals. They are often the difference between fear and protection, silence and justice, vulnerability and dignity.**

Throughout 2025, UN Human Rights carried out more than 5,000 monitoring missions and observed over 1,300 trials worldwide. The Office documented tens of thousands of violations, exposed discrimination in more than 100 countries, and helped secure the release of over 4,900 people from arbitrary detention. The Office also supported approximately 67,000 survivors of torture and contemporary forms of slavery, providing assistance and helping ensure that their suffering was not ignored...

## Transboundary Animal Diseases (TADs)

### [FAO calls for stronger prevention and global action as transboundary animal diseases spread across regions](#)

*Animal diseases, including avian influenza, African swine fever, foot-and-mouth disease and New World screwworm, pose growing risks to food security, trade and livelihoods*

Rome – Countries around the world are facing a growing threat from, including New World Screwworm, African Swine Fever, Avian Influenza, Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and Peste des Petits Ruminants, as well as other emerging zoonotic threats such as Andes hantavirus, Ebola, and Nipah. **As diseases and pests move more rapidly across borders, countries are facing increasing pressure to strengthen prevention, preparedness and response systems.**

The stakes are high. Livestock sectors support more than one billion livelihoods and contribute trillions of dollars in economic value each year. Protecting animal health is therefore critical not only for farmers and livestock keepers, but also for food security, trade, economic stability, and rural prosperity.

**The factors driving disease spread are becoming increasingly complex. Increased movement of animals, people and products, changing production systems, environmental pressures and uneven veterinary and surveillance capacity are creating new opportunities for diseases and pests to spread across regions.** Addressing these threats requires stronger surveillance, earlier detection, greater information sharing and closer international cooperation.

"The impacts of these outbreaks extend far beyond animal health. They disrupt agricultural production, trade, and tourism, threaten livelihoods, increase food security risks, and in some cases pose direct risks to human health," said Dr Tiensin Thanawat, FAO Assistant Director-General, Director of the Animal Production and Health Division, and Chief Veterinarian.

**The economic impacts of transboundary animal diseases are substantial.** Avian influenza has resulted in the loss of more than 633 million poultry and threatens a \$48 billion market, while foot-and-mouth disease causes \$11.3 billion in annual losses and African swine fever has reduced pig herds by

over 40 percent in some parts of Asia. These impacts underscore the importance of stronger surveillance, faster detection and coordinated international action.

**Recent developments highlight the urgency of the challenge. New World Screwworm has now re-emerged in the United States of America** after decades of successful containment, following its northward spread through Central America and Mexico. At the same time, the emergence and international spread of the SAT1 serotype of Foot-and-Mouth disease beyond its historical range in Africa has raised concern across parts of Asia, the Middle East and other regions. These developments demonstrate how quickly animal health threats can cross borders and create significant risks for food production, trade, and livelihoods.

**Strong prevention and preparedness remain the most effective and least costly tools for reducing the impact of animal disease outbreaks.**

**When outbreaks exceed national capacity, FAO acts as the Provider of Last Resort**, rapidly deploying expertise, coordinating the response, and mobilizing resources to sustain action when national systems are overwhelmed or other actors cannot operate...

**FAO is working with Members to develop the Global Partnership Programme for Transboundary Animal Diseases (GPP-TAD), a long-term, country-owned platform focused on prevention, early warning, preparedness, anticipatory action and rapid response.** The objective is to help countries detect and contain outbreaks earlier, reduce disruptions to food production and trade, and minimize the need for costly emergency interventions.

**The programme is being developed as a collaborative, multi-partner initiative—including with organizations such as the World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH)**—with a focus on strengthening national capacities, supporting sustainable financing approaches, and better linking country-level investments with regional and global support. Building on decades of experience, the initiative aims to strengthen existing international efforts and help countries move from reactive responses toward more durable systems for prevention and preparedness.

## **Science – Multilateralism**

### **[Embed science as a pillar of multilateralism, the global scientific community tells UNSG candidates](#)**

ISC / International Science Council 11 June 2026

**In this open letter to candidates for UN Secretary-General, the International Science Council and its member organizations call on the next UN leader to recognize science as a pillar of the multilateral system and to institutionalize its role in global decision-making**, at a moment when global challenges grow more complex and international collaboration is increasingly under strain.

#### ***Dear candidates,***

The next Secretary-General will take office at a moment of acute tension between the scale of global challenges and the fragility of multilateral cooperation. Meeting that challenge will require more than diplomatic skill. It will depend on the UN's ability to systematically and proactively mobilize diverse forms of knowledge across its full range of priorities, from the climate crisis and rising inequality to the governance of emerging technologies.

The International Science Council and its 250 member organizations across the natural and social

sciences therefore **call upon the next United Nations Secretary-General to position science as a central pillar of global governance.**

The UN has demonstrated what is possible when science and multilateralism work in concert. **The IPCC remains one of the most consequential science-policy interfaces ever built. The revitalized Secretary-General's Scientific Advisory Board has more recently proven effective in advancing shared understanding among UN leadership.** Yet scientific knowledge remains too often an ad hoc input to decision-making, and access to scientific expertise remains uneven across Member States.

**These gaps are widening at precisely the moment when global challenges demand deeper scientific cooperation,** as governments increasingly view international collaboration through a security lens, treating shared knowledge as a strategic liability rather than an asset. In this environment, the UN's role as a trusted forum where scientific cooperation transcends geopolitical divides becomes all the more vital — and partnership between the UN and the global scientific community can, and must, run deeper.

**The ISC sees at least three fronts on which the next Secretary-General can act decisively to embed science more deeply in the UN system:**

**Firstly, strengthen the pathways through which scientific knowledge informs decision-making at the international level.** Millions of scientists, thousands of Indigenous knowledge systems, and emerging forms of citizen science collectively represent a vast, underutilized body of knowledge. What is lacking are effective, institutionalized mechanisms to make that knowledge accessible and actionable for all Member States. This means reforming existing permanent and ad hoc UN advisory mechanisms and designing new ones to build the science-policy interfaces that can translate knowledge and research into coordinated global action.

**Secondly, place the social sciences at the heart of the UN's effort to understand, anticipate and respond to change.** These disciplines are indispensable to understanding the societal and ethical implications of technologies and innovations that are reshaping societies faster than institutions can adapt. We cannot afford to deploy them without the ethical reflection and strategic foresight needed to anticipate both their benefits and the dual use risks they may create. Ensuring that international oversight frameworks keep pace with these developments is one of the most consequential responsibilities the next Secretary-General will inherit.

**Thirdly, champion fair and equitable access to knowledge as a concrete expression of the UN's founding promise.** Knowledge is one of the few resources that grows in value when shared — yet the capacity to produce knowledge and contribute to global decision-making remains profoundly unequal.

To enable strong evidence-based decision-making it is essential that low- and middle-income countries have equitable access to scientific knowledge, opportunities to disseminate the knowledge they generate, and meaningful pathways to contribute their expertise to global policy discussions. **The right to participate in and benefit from scientific progress is recognized internationally as a human right. Realizing this right requires safeguarding scientific freedom and fostering an environment in which scientists can collaborate, communicate and exchange knowledge across borders.**

Some of the greatest achievements of recent decades have come from scientists and policymakers acting with shared purpose: the eradication of smallpox, the phase-out of ozone-depleting substances and the mapping of the human genome. These were not accidents; they were the

product of sustained institutional commitment to science as a global commons. That commitment continues to enjoy broad public support. Citizens across 68 countries [report](#) high levels of trust in scientists and want them to be more involved in shaping policy. This is a foundation the next Secretary-General should build on.

**With the UN80 reform process underway and attention turning to the post-2030 development agenda, a new mandate offers a real opportunity to institutionalize science as a permanent feature of UN action** — not only as a resource summoned in emergencies, but a standing infrastructure for the collective intelligence the world’s challenges demand.

As the world’s largest organization bringing together scientific unions, academies and research communities across disciplines and regions, the International Science Council stands ready to support the next Secretary-General and to serve as a trusted partner between the UN system and the global scientific community in building the renewed multilateral cooperation we all rely on.

### **Fractured reality**

#### ***How democracy can win the global struggle over the information space***

*Abstract*

**The report examines the evolving impact of digital technologies on European democracy.**

In an era of a global struggle to control the information space, **this report offers critical insights into the fracturing of perceived realities, the rise of the “fantasy-industrial complex,”** and the systemic risks posed by the attention economy. It exposes how platforms algorithmically prioritise engagement over accuracy, reinforcing ideological echo chambers and amplifying mis- and disinformation that erode democratic resilience.

**The report highlights how structural incentives and foreign control of the most important players in the information space undermine information integrity, collective knowledge and civic discourse.** In response, the report presents a number of recommendations from fostering alternative public spaces and crowd-sourced knowledge systems to reforming business models, restoring user agency, and advancing EU digital sovereignty through decentralised infrastructure.

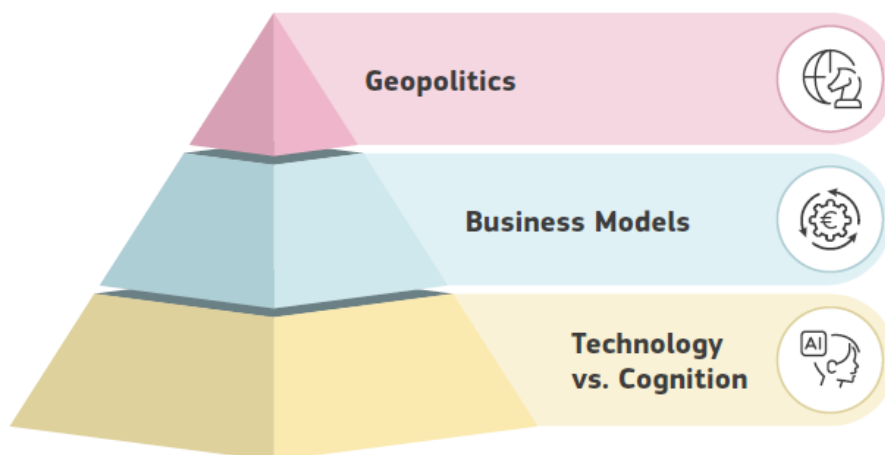
#### **...1.1 DEMOCRACY AND THE INFORMATION SPACE**

Democracy is essential for the European Union (EU) not only for peace and security, but also for social cohesion as a foundation for long-term economic development. These principles have been affirmed in the recent European Democracy Shield (EDS) (JOIN (2025) 791). Democracy is multi-dimensional, touching on questions from local civic engagement all the way up to the international geopolitical order, but all of these are currently fundamentally being reshaped by changes to the information space.

**This report re-examines four interrelated drivers of the effect of technology on the integrity of the information space (Figure 1.1).**

**Figure 1.1:** The challenges to the EU's democratic information spaces online operate on three levels: "Technology vs. Cognition" (Chapter 2), "Business Models" (Chapter 3), and "Geopolitics" (Chapter 4) at the top of the pyramid.

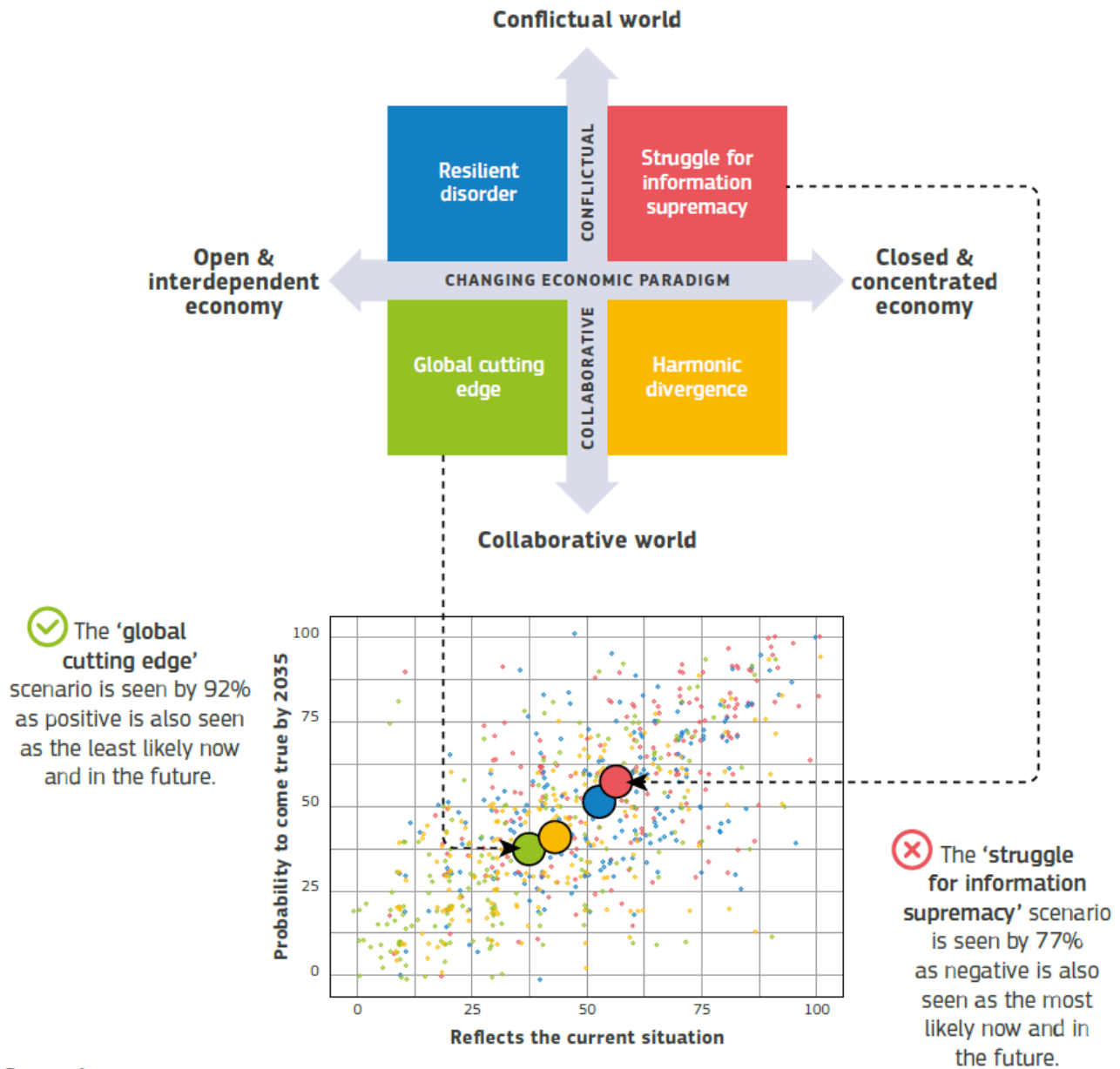

**Figure 5.1:** Possible future scenarios developed during an expert elicitation in 2020 (on the left) and expert views on their present prevalence and future likelihood (right). The scatterplot shows responses to questions about the extent to which the scenario “reflects elements of the current situation in Europe” (X-axis) and “the probability that the scenario will come true by 2035” (Y-axis) on a scale from 0-100 ( $n = 201$ ).



**Scenarios**

- **Struggle for information supremacy:** assumes that the future European information space will be marked by high degrees of conflict and economic concentration. The EU is struggling to keep at least some degree of coherence in the European information space. Less than 3% of experts considered this to be beneficial for society.
- **Resilient disorder:** the EU has fostered a competitive, dynamic and decentralised information space with strong international interdependence, but is facing continuous threats from sophisticated disinformation campaigns and cyberattacks. Seen by 25% as beneficial for society.
- **Harmonic divergence:** assumes a world in which strong regulatory differences and economic protectionism between national and regional actors have resulted in a fractured, but not entirely conflictual, global information space. Seen by 60% as beneficial for society.
- **Global cutting edge:** foresees a world in which societal and geopolitical conflict have been reduced significantly, while high degrees of competition and innovation have led to the emergence of a dynamic, global information space. More than 90% of experts consider this as beneficial for society.

*Overview*

This report presents the findings of the Global Research Prioritization Exercise (GRPE) on health, migration and displacement in the context of climate change, the first thematic prioritization initiative developed under the WHO Global research agenda on health, migration and displacement. Recognizing climate change as an increasingly important driver of migration and displacement and a determinant of health, the report addresses critical evidence gaps concerning the health of migrant and displaced populations throughout the migration journey. Using a structured and participatory methodology that included a scoping review, technical consultations and stakeholder surveys, the exercise identified priority research areas and knowledge gaps to support evidence-informed policy and practice. The publication highlights research priorities across three core themes—social determinants of health, universal health coverage, and emergencies—and two cross-cutting themes focused on data, policy and interventions, and health outcomes. 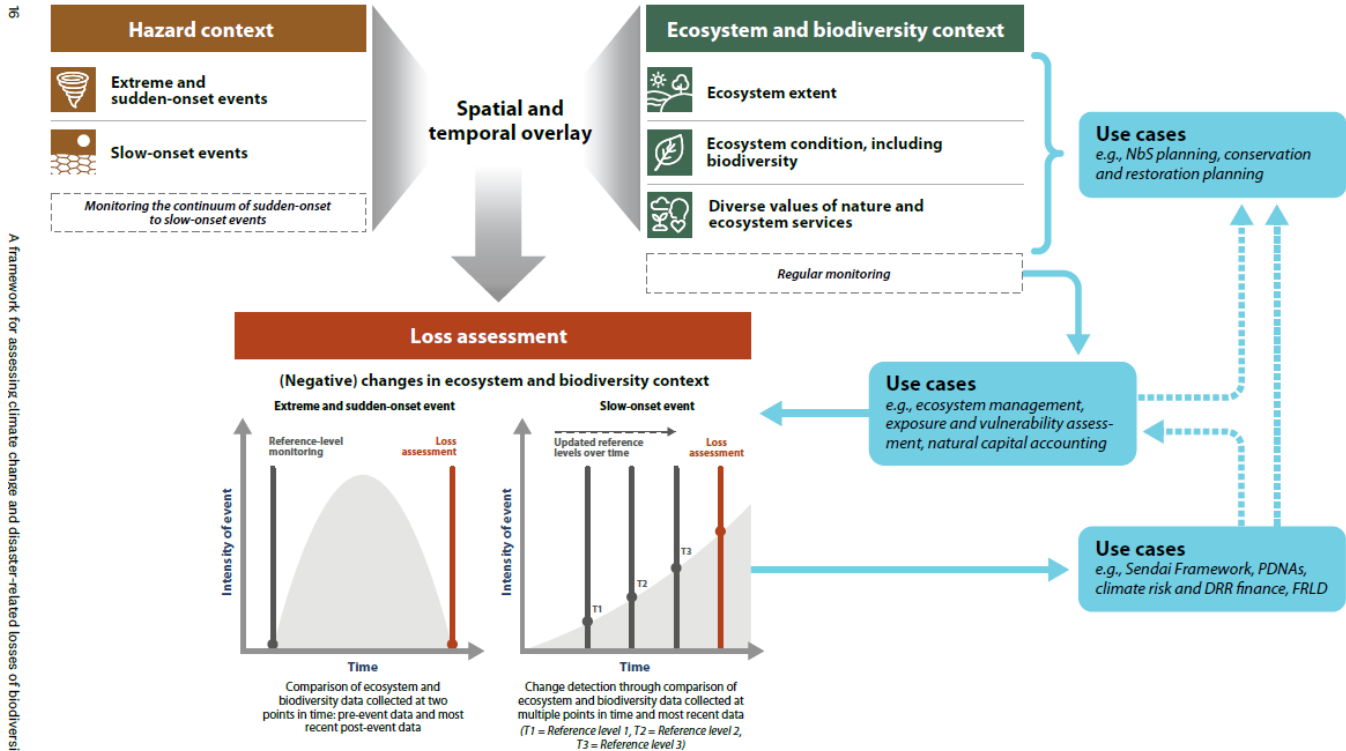

This week, the U.S. Department of State and Starlink signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to enhance international disaster preparedness and U.S. humanitarian response efforts worldwide. The two-year MOU leverages Starlink’s low-Earth orbit satellite technology, an American innovation, to restore critical communications when crises and natural disasters damage infrastructure. The Department’s Bureau of Disaster and Humanitarian Response will coordinate with Starlink to provide rapid connectivity to emergency responders, humanitarian organizations following disasters, and people in need. Communication can mean the difference between life and death. This cooperation harnesses reliable connectivity to support disaster response teams and help save lives around the world.

The signing of this MOU aligns with Starlink’s own Crisis Response global disaster response initiative and is just one way that the United States is enhancing humanitarian assistance. *Four Shifts in Our Approach*

The new strategy is not just a statement of our commitment. It changes how we identify risk, how we decide where and how to engage, how we bring the full World Bank Group together around jobs, and how we equip ourselves to deliver in the hardest places.

:: Anticipate risks earlier:

Our systems have been better at identifying fragility after it has already materialized. Going forward, we will use a dynamic FCV country classification and stronger internal risk-monitoring process to spot where

pressures are building — including countries at risk of conflict onset, countries affected by conflict, countries in acute crisis, and countries in transition. This will help us act earlier, adjust programs sooner, and avoid waiting until risks become full-blown crises.

:: Support Government commitment:

The needs are real everywhere, but the potential for lasting impact is not the same everywhere. We will look more clearly at whether there is a path to durable results: government commitment to trajectory-shifting reforms, credible local delivery platforms where we cannot work through government, windows of opportunity in transition settings, and the readiness of the private sector. Where the conditions are present, we should move with speed and scale. Where they are not, we should remain engaged but be more selective.

:: Deliver as One World Bank Group on jobs:

Jobs are where we have the clearest mandate and the strongest comparative advantage. But in FCV settings, jobs do not come from one instrument or one institution. They require public investment, policy reform, private capital, guarantees, advisory work, and risk mitigation working together. IBRD, IDA, IFC, and MIGA will be brought together more deliberately — especially around Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and the domestic private sector, which are the backbone of employment in many FCV economies.

:: Change how we operate.

We will strengthen our operational tools, adapt procurement and implementation approaches where conditions demand it and invest in staff who are asked to work in these contexts. The strategy also recognizes that the WBG cannot do this alone. Other actors hold mandates over political settlements, security, justice, and peace — areas outside the development mandate but essential to stability. That is why the refreshed strategy places a strong emphasis on building and expanding partnerships with humanitarian actors, civil society, UN agencies, regional organizations, and the private sector, while leveraging local actors who often detect stress earlier than institutions do.

*Abstract*

Epidemic forecasting and public health policy evaluation rely on mathematical models, but traditional approaches struggle in data-limited settings. We evaluated whether transformer-based, foundation Artificial Intelligence models can serve as a new epidemic modeling framework. We tested five models across pathogens and locations, including influenza, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), chickenpox, dengue. Foundation models demonstrated strong accuracy in short-term forecasts and predicted multiple epidemic waves. They outperformed standard implementations of established models on limited and irregular data. We showed foundation models can generate scenarios for policy evaluation, estimating the effect of tighter restrictions on COVID-19 cases during the Alpha variant surge in Italy in 2021. We also used them to estimate the effectiveness of the 2023 RSV immunization campaign in Paris, France. Our findings suggest foundation models can complement existing modeling approaches. Their ability to generate forecasts and counterfactual analyses with minimal data highlights their potential for public health, particularly in emergent and resource-constrained settings.

How to engage with AI and on what terms? Which new values and design principles are required to build democratic resilience? Scientific AI agents increasingly retrieve evidence, reason across sources, and synthesize conclusions used in consequential decisions. Yet, their ability to do so in high-stakes domains such as health remains unclear. We introduce SciConBench, a large-scale live benchmark of 9.11K questions and expert-written conclusions from systematic reviews to evaluate open-domain scientific conclusion synthesis. The benchmark draws on an expert-validated automated evaluation pipeline that decomposes conclusions into atomic facts and measures correctness and comprehensiveness via factual precision and recall. To mitigate data leakage, we further introduce SciConHarness, a clean-room evaluation harness that equips agents with controlled web interaction to ensure valid measurement. Evaluating 8 frontier models and deep research agents, we find that factual quality remains low: under clean-room settings, the best agent achieves only a factual F1 of 0.337. Our clean-room setting consistently reduces performance relative to unconstrained evaluation, suggesting that leakage inflates estimates of models' true synthesis capabilities. Finally, we audit consumer-facing agents (e.g., Google AI Overview, OpenEvidence) and find they frequently generate incomplete and sometimes contradictory conclusions, even when the ground-truth answer is available. Overall, our results show that reliable synthesis of scientific conclusions remains an open challenge, and that clean-room evaluation is essential for assessing open-domain AI agents.

...The [Declaration of Taipei](#) tries to achieve a balance between the rights of individuals giving their tissue or data for research and other purposes based on confidentiality and privacy rules while at the same time recognising that health data has become a very powerful tool for increasing knowledge.

In analysing the scenarios that already exist for the use (and misuse) of health data and biobanks, we came to the conclusion that the major risk scenarios may not result from science, but from the commercial, administrative or political use of such data. Limiting our guidelines to research only would have left us blind to the imminent risk of abuse from outside the field of medicine: commercialization,

cost-cutting and potential political abuse.

Therefore, in contrast to the Declaration of Helsinki, this policy aims to address any use of health databases and biobanks excluding individual treatment and is not restricted to research. As physicians are the primary custodians of confidential health information, they feel an obligation towards their patients and other persons who entrust them with their data and specimens...

In April 2025, the WMA appointed a workgroup to initiate the revision process of this document. To encourage as much global participation in the revision process as possible, the WMA is collaborating with its members to host a series of regional meetings...
