Secretary-General Pledges Full Support to Rebuild Trust in Multilateral System, at Opening of General Assembly's Eighty-First Session

Following are UN Secretary-General António Guterres' remarks at the opening of the eighty-first session of the United Nations General Assembly, in New York today:

Mr. President of the General Assembly, congratulations, once again, on your election. And I thank the outgoing President — Her Excellency, Annalena Baerbock — for so ably guiding this Assembly over the last year.

I pledge my full support to you, President Khalilur Rahman (Bangladesh), as you take on this important role. Your remarkable political and diplomatic experience — together with your deep knowledge of the United Nations — are the best guarantees of success as you assume this high office. Throughout your distinguished career, you have demonstrated an unwavering commitment to dialogue, consensus-building and international cooperation — qualities that will serve the General Assembly well in the year ahead.

And I welcome the theme of your presidency — “Restoring Trust, Managing Transformation: A United Nations that Delivers for All”. Rebuilding trust in the multilateral system is the defining challenge of our time. And I look forward to working with you, Mr. President, to continue this critical effort.

In these tumultuous times, the global problem-solving system is more crucial than ever. We face conflicts, divisions and a risk of nuclear escalation, persistent poverty and inequality, worsening climate chaos, technology like artificial intelligence (AI) that offers great promise, but also great peril without good governance and transparency around its environmental footprint, and sluggish progress on the Sustainable Development Goals.

Displacement is near record levels. Human suffering is intensifying while funding for aid and development is being slashed. The institutions of the multilateral system — from the UN Security Council, to the international financial architecture — are straining to meet the moment.

International law and human rights — the core of our Organization — are too often flouted with impunity. And geopolitical mistrust and suspicion continue to block the effective solutions we need — and erode people's faith in the possibilities of global cooperation.

But, as I join you in this opening of a General Assembly session for the last time as Secretary-General, **I have enormous hope thanks to the work that happens here.**

From the start, this has been the place where the world's toughest and most consequential problems are confronted head-on. Under your leadership Mr. President, through diplomacy, dialogue and

collaboration, **this Assembly can rebuild the trust and good faith that is missing from our geopolitics today, and ensure the people of the world inherit a better, healthier and more peaceful future.**

Our direction is clear. **The Pact for the Future and the UN80 Initiative represent a blueprint for action, solutions and bold reforms to carry our Organization into the future.** The work of this Assembly is critical to bringing these commitments to life.

As we embark on the eighty-first General Assembly, let's meet the moment. Let's live up to the great promise of this Organization, and through solidarity deliver the solutions our world needs. Mr. President, you can count on my full support in this vital effort.

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Two-State Solution

Joint Foreign Ministers' Statement on the Two-State Solution

Statement of the Foreign Ministers of Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Iceland, Ireland, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Spain, Sweden and the UK on the Two-State Solution.

08 September 2026

1. **The Government of Israel's actions in the West Bank are undermining the possibility of a two-State solution. The situation is rapidly deteriorating amid unprecedented levels of settler violence and settlement expansion**, including the unacceptable decision to publish tenders for the E1 settlement project. UK Prime Minister Andy Burnham, the President of France Emmanuel Macron and Prime Minister of Canada Mark Carney have agreed on the need to take action to prevent further damage
2. Today, **Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Iceland, Ireland, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Spain, Sweden and the UK confirm their intention to introduce national and/or support European restrictions on trade in goods with settlements which are illegal under international law**, or that they are actively considering these and other measures, in accordance with their national procedures. In this regard, the UK, France and Canada welcome the important action already taken by Ireland, Spain, the Netherlands, Norway and Belgium and will bring forward national measures to ban trade in settlement goods.
3. Together, **we are resolute: the two-state solution must be protected, and we will take action in pursuit of a just and lasting peace**, based on the principles enshrined in the New York Declaration adopted one year ago. We firmly oppose actions tantamount to the annexation of Palestinian land and forcible displacement of the Palestinian population.
4. **The Government of Israel must immediately halt the expansion of settlements and civilian administrative powers**, ensure accountability for settler violence, and investigate allegations against Israeli forces.
5. We recognize Israel's legitimate security interests and reiterate our condemnation of the Hamas 7 October terrorist attack, the worst antisemitic massacre since the Holocaust. We are clear in our determination to tackle antisemitism wherever it occurs. We are unequivocally committed to the two-state solution, in accordance with relevant UN Security Council resolutions, that enables Israel and a sovereign, democratic and viable Palestinian state to live side by side in peace, security and mutual recognition within secure and internationally recognised borders.

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PISA 2025: Students' reading and mathematics performance declined sharply across the OECD [OECD Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA)]

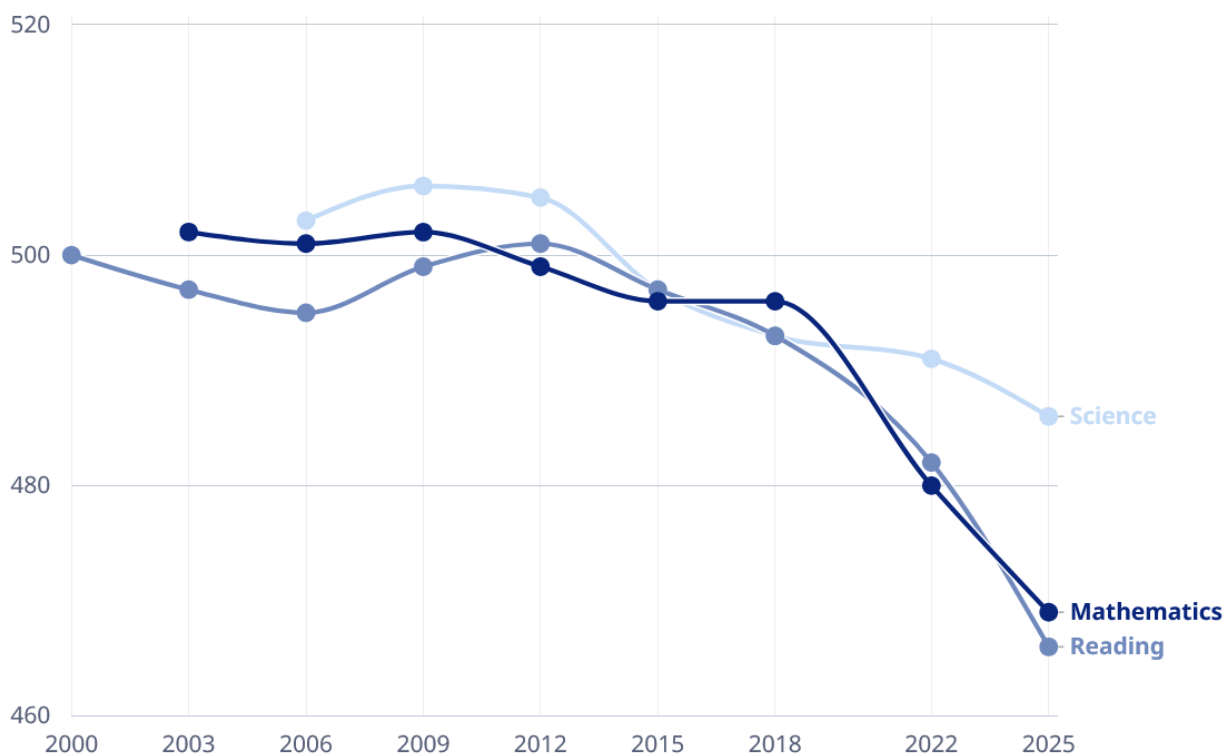
Student performance across OECD countries has continued to decline, **reaching the lowest average ever recorded by the OECD Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) in mathematics and reading**. Across the OECD, one in five 15-year-old students is now a low performer in science, mathematics and reading, up from 16% in 2022.

PISA 2025 was the largest assessment to date, involving 760 000 students across 91 countries and economies. This year's edition focused on science, where average performance was stable between 2022 and 2025 across OECD countries, after having trended downward between 2009 and 2022.

Average reading scores fell by 28 points across OECD countries between 2015 and 2025, equivalent to about one and a half years of learning. Mathematics scores fell by 22 points, equivalent to just over one year of learning. Among non-OECD PISA participants, reading scores fell by 16 points and mathematics scores by eight points over the same period.

Socio-economic background remains a powerful predictor of performance. Across OECD countries, advantaged students scored 85 points higher in science than disadvantaged students. The gap narrowed between 2022 and 2025, but largely because advantaged students performed less well rather than improvements among disadvantaged students.

"PISA 2025 shows that reversing declines in student performance is urgent. The most

successful education systems focus on fewer areas in greater depth, invest in teachers, engage parents and provide targeted support for the students and schools that need it the most,” said OECD Secretary-General Mathias Cormann. “Technology and AI can strengthen learning and help prepare young people for the future, but only when used purposefully and not as a substitute for attention, effort and understanding.”...

PISA 2025 also shows that **when artificial intelligence and digital tools are used, they should be used with care, for clearly defined purposes, and in moderation.** Students tended to perform less well when use became excessive or when devices were used for leisure at school.

Digital distraction also affects the wider classroom. More than one in four students said that classmates were distracted by digital devices in most or every science lesson. Students surrounded by distracted classmates performed less well, were less engaged in learning and felt less connected to their school.

Students who say they did not use AI to draft text for writing assignments outperformed those who say they did. Among frequent users, however, **students who used AI to help them learn and were taught how to assess the quality of AI-generated information tended to perform better than those who received no such guidance....**

The National Academies are seeking suggestions for experts to serve on the Standing Committee on Use of AI in Science: Integrity, Trust, and Innovation in the Scientific Enterprise. **The standing committee will explore how artificial intelligence is challenging norms and standards, and what governance mechanisms can be used to ensure research trustworthiness, reproducibility, and alignment with societal values.**

The standing committee will host a series of public sessions organized around key topics, including research integrity and reproducibility; transparency and trustworthiness; authorship and accountability; and peer review. We invite you to submit your suggestions by September 30, 2026.

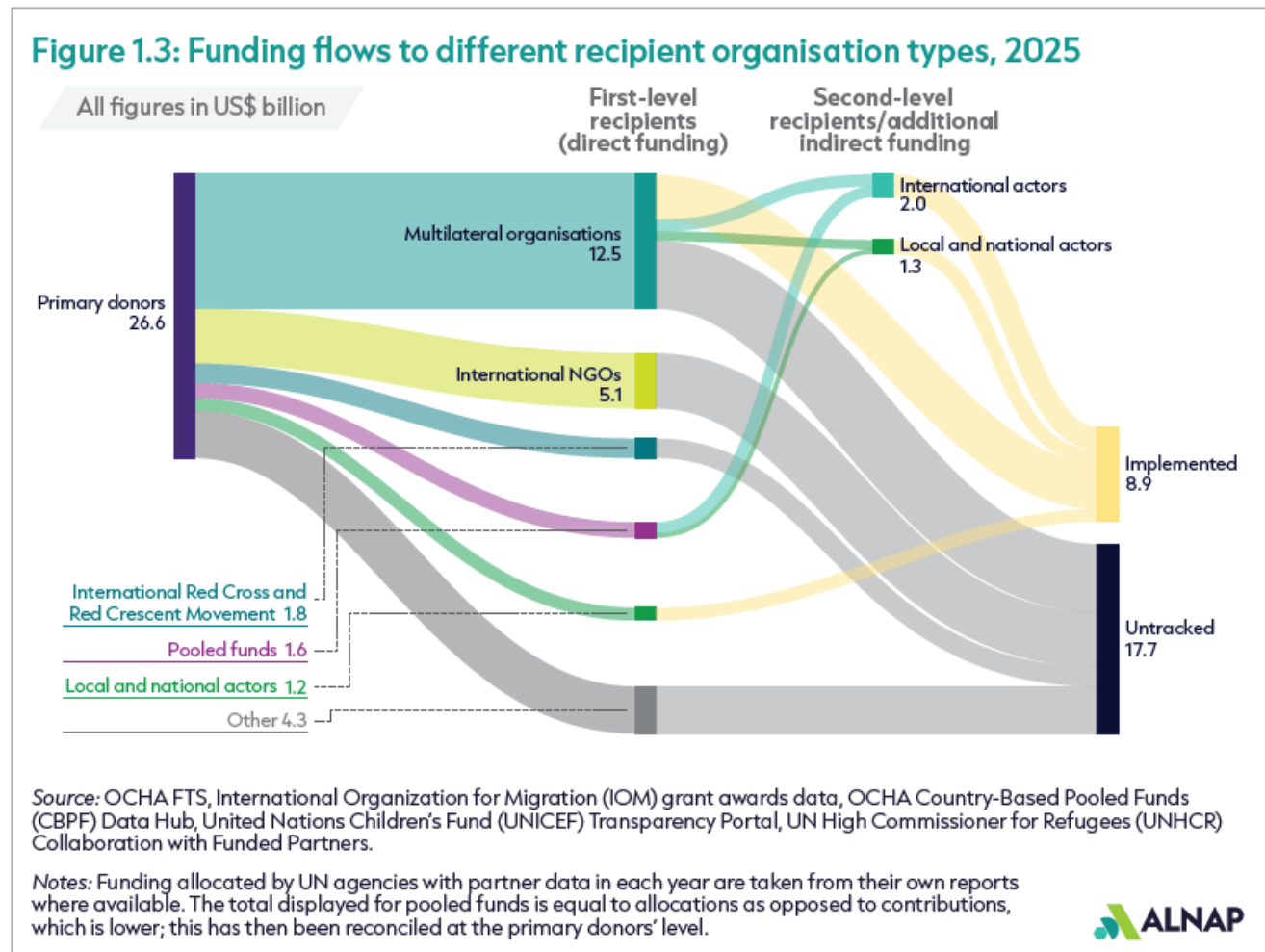
The State of the Humanitarian System (SOHS) Report 2026

The year 2026 marks twenty years since ALNAP began gathering data for the first edition of The State of the Humanitarian System (SOHS). This sixth edition examines the performance of the international humanitarian system from 2022 to 2025, arguably one of the most turbulent periods in its history. Humanitarian needs rose sharply, driven by worsening food insecurity, high levels of forced displacement, more frequent climate shocks, and multiple new and protracted conflicts. At the same time, increasing violations of international humanitarian law (IHL) by state and non-state actors heightened protection risks for civilians and humanitarian actors. Just as needs peaked, the international humanitarian system experienced its greatest financial contraction, with funding falling by 30% from a record high in 2022 as major government donors cut their support.

...**Multilaterals passed on US\$807 million to LNAs.**^{vii} Pooled funds passed the second-largest amount to LNAs: US\$469 million in direct contributions. Two-thirds of funding that was passed through beyond the first level was not tracked on centralised platforms like the OCHA FTS, emphasising a need for better reporting by humanitarian donor and recipient organisations.⁸

Funding in this period remained concentrated in the same three UN agencies as in the previous The State of the Humanitarian System (SOHS) period (2018–21). **These three agencies received 44% of**

total funding: the World Food Programme (WFP) was the largest recipient (receiving 25%), followed by UNHCR (10%) and UNICEF (9%). This was a reduction from the 48% received in the previous SOHS period.

The 2025 funding cuts caused a greater year-on-year shift for WFP, whose share of funding reduced from 25% in 2024 to 21% in 2025.^{viii} Among INGOs specifically, NRC, Save the Children and the International Rescue Committee (IRC) received the largest proportion of funding in this period: 1.2%, 1.2% and 0.9%, respectively.^{ix}

Over 20,000 precolonial earthworks in the Southwest Amazonia

Using canopy-penetrating LiDAR data, the northern part of southwestern Amazonia appears to contain as many earthworks as previously estimated for the whole of Amazonia.

Abstract

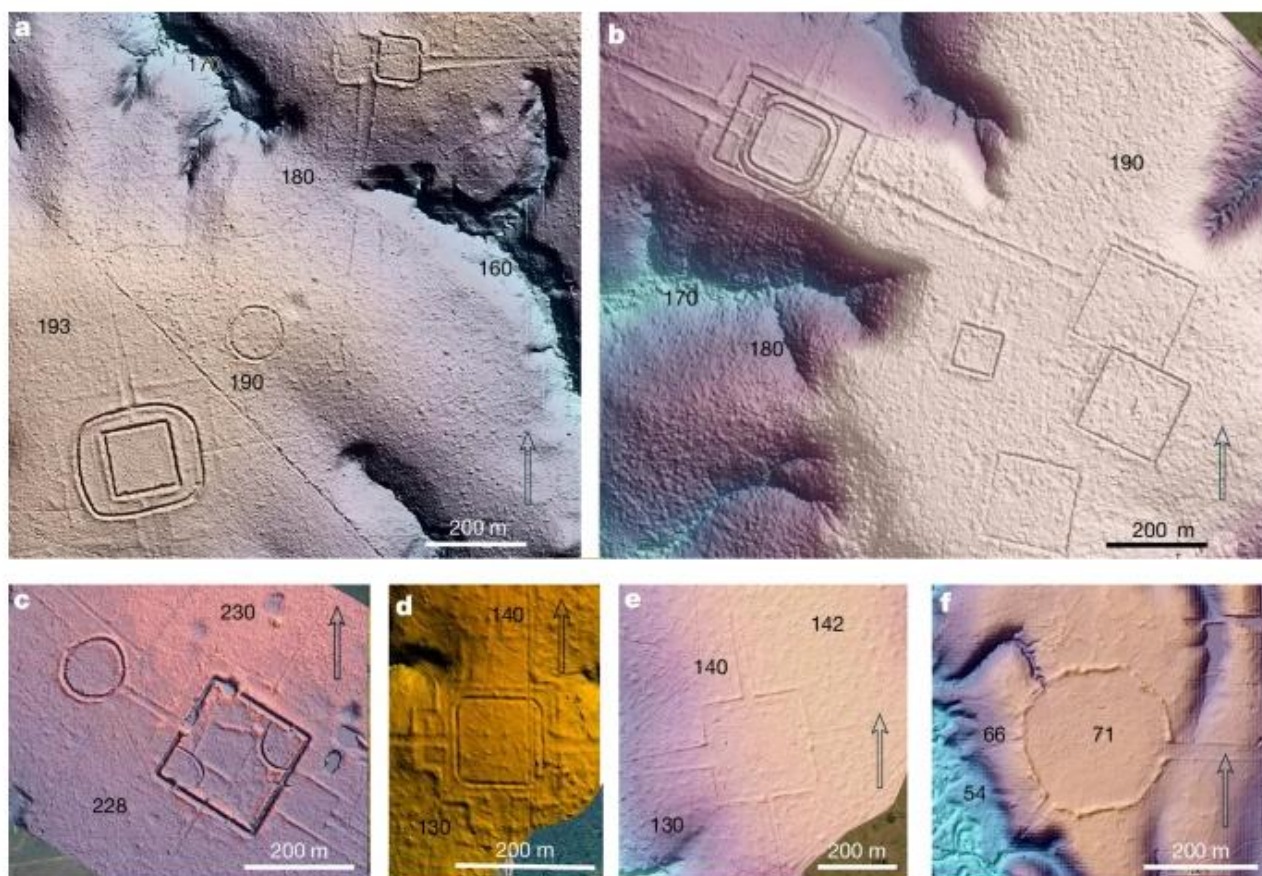
Numerous geometric earthworks have been found in southwestern Amazonia, evidence of a monument-building precolonial civilization^{1,2,3}. This knowledge has contributed to the discussion about the deep history and the precolonial urbanism of Amazonia, its sociocultural contexts and its environmental legacy^{2,4,5,6,7,8}. Estimates of the geographical extent and population size of the forest civilization have remained weak, because the detection of earthworks has been almost exclusively limited to deforested areas where vegetation does not completely hide the structures.

Here we used canopy-penetrating LiDAR data over 4,430 km of flight to define the geographical distribution and quantity of earthworks in this region better. On the basis of both existing data and our LiDAR documentation, we show that this cultural area alone contains as many earthworks as previously estimated for the whole of Amazonia.

We also propose that the total human population of the area in 100–300 ad was 1.25–3 million people. If similar results are found elsewhere in Amazonia, the total precolonial population density and its effect on the current Amazonian soil and forest structure, biodiversity and even some modelling of the global climate should be re-evaluated.

Building such monumental works in the rainforest must have required a large workforce, division of labour and an understanding of mathematics and geometry. It is also clear that the construction and maintenance of such centres for around 1,500 years must have had administrative, sociocultural and cosmological motivations, including diverse forms of arts, dance, music and sport^{18,24,25}...

WHO guidelines for malaria

Overview

The *WHO guidelines for malaria* bring together the Organization's most up-to-date recommendations for malaria in one user-friendly and easy-to-navigate online platform.

Recommendations on malaria continue to be reviewed and, where appropriate, updated based on the latest available evidence. Any updated recommendations will always display the date of the most recent revision in the MAGICapp platform. With each update, a new PDF version of the consolidated guidelines will also be available for download on the WHO website.

This version of the Guidelines includes updated recommendations on: (i) intermittent preventive treatment in HIV-positive pregnant women; (ii) the use of single-dose primaquine for transmission blocking in areas of moderate to high malaria transmission; (iii) a new formulation of artemether-lumefantrine for treating malaria in children less than 5kg bw; and (iv) three-dose versus four-dose vaccination schedules in areas of perennial malaria transmission.

This user manual provides guidance on the application of the World Health Organization's Quick and Immediate Risk Assessment (QIRA) algorithm, a practical tool developed to support Member States in conducting rapid assessments of acute public health events within routine public health intelligence activities. Using an all-hazards approach, the manual explains how to apply the algorithm step by step to determine the immediate level of risk associated with verified signals or events and to identify appropriate initial response actions. It describes the algorithm's structure, including its domains, risk classification, predefined actions, confidence assessment and documentation requirements, and clarifies its relationship with other WHO risk assessment tools and the International Health Regulations (2005).

China's already strong position means focus should be on areas where jurisdiction, security, reliability, and control outweigh cost.
:: Collectively, Europe, Japan, South Korea, and others possess sufficient capital, technology, talent, industrial data, supply chain capabilities, and market scale to preserve meaningful technological agency. Binding and reciprocal public procurement can turn those assets into market scale by providing anchor customers, financeable revenue, and operational data.

Summary

Growing attention to health challenges, particularly those facing low- and middle-income countries, has led to the emergence of new global institutions over time, especially in the past twenty-five years.

Today, the global health architecture includes a number of diverse international organizations with different mandates, governance models, financing structures, and operational approaches. At the same time, several of these organizations support the same countries, address similar health issues, and rely on the same set of revenue sources. As such, questions have been raised about whether there is duplication and/or opportunity for synergies and better coordination across entities. These questions have become even more acute as fiscal environments have increasingly tightened. As a result, multiple reform efforts have been launched to explore these questions. As one input into these processes, KFF has developed a descriptive mapping of 14 key global health and related international institutions, with a focus on their work to address health challenges in low- and middle-income countries. By looking across a range of variables, it is intended to inform discussions about synergies and coordination, duplication, comparative advantage, shared challenges, and architectural reform.

At some point along life's trajectory, growing becomes aging. Gerotherapeutics—biologically-based approaches to health that target processes of aging—seem poised to respond. This theme issue investigates ethical valences of what gerotherapeutics suggest about our socially, culturally, and historically entrenched patterns of pathologizing and medicalizing aging. In genomic medicine, continuously updated public archives of genetic variants linked to clinical phenotypes, such as ClinVar and the Matchmaker Exchange, are essential for variant interpretation, patient diagnosis, and treatment. This form of data sharing typically does not require explicit patient consent, especially for de-identified variant-level data, but because there are no standard data sharing guidelines, clinicians, laboratories, and patients are often left uncertain about the practical boundaries and the rationale.

All of Us Research Program year in review: 2025

Tara Dutka, et al.

The All of Us Research Program¹ released its first genomic dataset (Curated Data Repository version 5 [CDRv5]) of almost 100,000 participants in 2022. Since then, All of Us has continued to expand the scale of its genomic offerings, releasing short-read whole genome sequencing (srWGS) for over 240,000 participants in 2023 (CDRv7) and for over 400,000 participants in 2025 (CDRv8). These genomic data are linked to a rich collection of phenotypic data encompassing electronic health records (EHRs), participant-provided information (PPI), and wearables, enabling a broad spectrum of research across diverse domains.

Clinical genomic data are increasingly shared for patient care, yet the rules governing sharing are often unclear. Its adoption creates a new infrastructure for both primary use, focusing on cross-border access to electronic health records for care, and secondary use, centred on research, innovation, public health, regulatory science and policymaking. In parallel, European biobanking has matured into a core research infrastructure supporting genomic medicine, biomarker discovery, rare disease research and precision public health. The convergence of EHDS-enabled electronic health records, BBMRI-ERIC-associated biobanks, and the 1+ Million Genomes initiative offers a plausible route towards federated, large-scale, molecularly informed health systems in Europe. This article critically examines that opportunities and challenges arising from this convergence. It argues that the EHDS and biobanking are complementary but not automatically interoperable. Biobanks provide depth: biospecimens, molecular assays, longitudinal cohorts and consented research infrastructures. The EHDS provides breadth: population-scale clinical trajectories, regulatory gateways, Health Data Access Bodies and Secure Processing Environments. The 1+ Million Genomes and Genomic Data Infrastructure initiatives provide a genomics-specific federated layer that may connect these ecosystems through standards such as GA4GH, Beacon, Phenopackets and FHIR-Genomics. However, substantial obstacles remain. These include uneven digital maturity across Member States, immature representation of biospecimen and omics metadata in clinical data models, unresolved interactions between EHDS opt-out mechanisms and biobank consent, fragmented national interpretations of the GDPR, sustainability constraints, environmental costs of petabyte-scale computing, and the risk that artificial intelligence trained on biased or incomplete datasets will reproduce health inequities. We argue that EHDS-biobank integration should not be regarded solely as a technical exercise. Rather, it represents a governance challenge involving trust, reciprocity, legal interpretation, standards development, infrastructure investment and public legitimacy. Without coordinated action, the EHDS may create a formally integrated yet substantively unequal data ecosystem. Conversely, with deliberate design and effective governance, it has the potential to provide Europe with a trustworthy, federated and clinically actionable research infrastructure.

...The objective of constructing an orderly new global health architecture, as if those leading this reform process are drawing their glittering new structure on a perfectly blank page, ignores the long-standing competitiveness and enmity between existing institutions that, once born, make it their overriding priority to live on indefinitely. Self-preservation is only part of the reason why reforms will stall and wither. There are too many vested interests among those who would prefer the status quo to continue. And, anyway, what of other regions of the world? Where are the diverse voices from Latin America? Or Asia? Or the Middle East? Where are civil society organisations? Would countries and their peoples even trust a new architecture once it was built? What is sometimes forgotten is that global health is about power—and the rich world, despite its kindly reassurances, will not loosen the ties that keep countries constrained and dependent. And remember: reform has been a subject for rumination ever since global health entered our lexicon. Are we not tired of the brooding vanity that informs so many of these discussions? Borges concluded his story this way: "A scattered dynasty of solitary men has changed the face of the world. Their task continues." The task of global health reform will undoubtedly continue, motivated by illusions of order and symmetry. Councils, panels, and task forces will thrive and reproduce. And this vast displacement activity will likely contribute not one trace of benefit to the health of peoples.

Abstract

Small-scale farmers in low-income countries are often encouraged to adopt new inputs and practices that generate significant societal benefits, such as improved nutrition, food safety, and environmental sustainability. The limited observability of these attributes, combined with small production scale and misaligned private incentives, leads to adoption levels below the social optimum. Addressing this issue often requires combining instruments identified by different scientific disciplines, spanning across multiple policy sectors, an exercise that is rarely articulated jointly. This paper aims to clarify this, through a simple conceptual framework that explains how farmers decide whether to adopt socially desirable inputs and practices, given the returns and costs they face, their access to financial instruments, and the information and preferences that shape their decisions. It identifies the relevant policy channels, and asks whether the social returns justify the public cost of delivering them. We apply it to three case studies: aflatoxin mitigation, biofortified crop varieties, and conservation agriculture. For each, we identify which parameters bind, which instruments can move them, and how emerging technologies may further contribute. [What Makes Creation Human? Authorship, Reasons, and Meaningful Human Control in Generative AI](#)

Generative artificial intelligence (GenAI) significantly expands creators' productive capacity, but this does not necessarily entail a corresponding increase in creative agency or authorship. This paper distinguishes creativity at the level of the work from creative agency at the level of the creator, and argues that human authorship cannot be determined solely by manual intervention, degree of automation, the origin of an initial idea, or final selection authority. Rather, authorship depends on whether human judgment and reasons genuinely shape the development of the work.

To articulate this requirement, the paper introduces Meaningful Human Control (MHC) into generative creation and identifies a limitation of its classical tracking condition. Creative reasons are not always fully specified prior to interaction with AI; they may emerge, change, or be abandoned as the creative process unfolds. The paper therefore proposes dynamic-reflexive tracking (DRT), which requires that a creator's evolving reasons undergo reflective uptake, exert genuine influence on the subsequent trajectory of creation, and remain capable of rejecting and redirecting the system's default direction.

DRT consists of four conditions: diachronic reason formation, reflective uptake, trajectory efficacy, and contestability and redirection, together with a minimal tracing requirement. The paper argues that human authorship under generative AI depends not on how many steps a person personally performs, but on whether that person's reasons continuously, reflectively, and effectively shape what the work becomes.

African DSI DataBank: A federated infrastructure for Africa's biodiversity data

Description

A new platform lets African organisations host, store, study, govern, and share their own genomic and biodiversity digital sequence data - while keeping full custody of it. Here is what it is, how it works, and how to join. The African Digital Sequence Information DataBank for Biodiversity and Agriculture (African DSI DataBank, <https://africansidatabank.africa>), developed by the African BioGenome Project (AfricaBP), is launching as a federated platform built specifically to host, curate, and govern access to Africa-origin biodiversity and agricultural DSI. This paper introduces it, briefly describes how it is put together, how data moves through it, and how an organisation, a researcher, or a funder can engage with it.

A veterinary genomics laboratory in West Africa sequences the genome of a locally

adapted cattle breed prized for its natural resistance to trypanosomiasis (Kim et al., 2017), a disease that costs African livestock breeders billions of dollars a year (Yaro et al., 2016). Once a high-quality genome assembly has been generated, the standard practice is to deposit the data in one of the three sequence databases that form the International Nucleotide Sequence Database Collaboration (INSDC) (Karsch-Mizrachi et al., 2025), which together hold almost all of the world's public nucleotide sequence data. This case in point is one baseline example from a vast inventory of potential genomes yet to be sequenced across a continent that is one of the planet's greatest reservoirs of biological diversity with unparalleled levels of endemism. But, is this global default automatically aligned with Africa's strategic needs, and should it remain the only pathway?

...The Declaration of Taipei tries to achieve a balance between the rights of individuals giving their tissue or data for research and other purposes based on confidentiality and privacy rules while at the same time recognising that health data has become a very powerful tool for increasing knowledge.

In analysing the scenarios that already exist for the use (and misuse) of health data and biobanks, we came to the conclusion that the major risk scenarios may not result from science, but from the commercial, administrative or political use of such data. Limiting our guidelines to research only would have left us blind to the imminent risk of abuse from outside the field of medicine: commercialization, cost-cutting and potential political abuse.

Therefore, in contrast to the Declaration of Helsinki, this policy aims to address any use of health databases and biobanks excluding individual treatment and is not restricted to research. As physicians are the primary custodians of confidential health information, they feel an obligation towards their patients and other persons who entrust them with their data and specimens...

In April 2025, the WMA appointed a workgroup to initiate the revision process of this document. To encourage as much global participation in the revision process as possible, the WMA is collaborating with its members to host a series of regional meetings...
